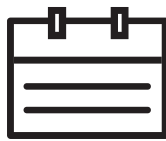


The RN-BSN bridge program is designed to enhance the knowledge of individuals with an associate degree in nursing (ADN) who are licensed as registered nurses. The program curriculum focuses on enhancing communications skills, use of technology and informatics, critical thinking, leadership, integration of research findings, and interpretation of statistics. Upon completing the program, students will be prepared for advancement to a variety of graduate programs.

## Admission Requirements

Applicants must have graduated from an approved associate degree nursing program and have an uncensored registered nurse license. Students who are currently enrolled in the final year of an associate degree in nursing program may apply with admission pending graduation from the program and their passing of the NCLEX-RN exam within 90 days of graduation.

- uncensored registered nurse license
- GPA of 2.80 on a 4.0 scale (may be tentatively admitted with a 2.50 GPA)

## Admission Process

The admission process will not begin until all application materials are received. Materials are not reviewed before this time. Applications are accepted on a continuous basis and seats are offered first come, first serve to students who meet the admission requirements. **All applications materials are due on Monday, by 5:00 PM, 4 weeks prior to the start of the program or the semester students wish to begin taking courses.** Applications that are not completed by this deadline will be rolled over to the next program start date or semester.

## Cost and Financial Aid

As a part of the admission and enrollment process, students will incur the following costs upfront:

- \$50 application fee
- \$100 seat retainer (deposit)
- \$93 CastleBranch fee

## Accreditation

All courses require a C or better to be considered passing.

Students must complete a total of 120 semester hours with at least 30 hours of RN-BSN core courses taken at SoutheastHEALTH College of Nursing and Health Sciences

RN-BSN students are granted transfer credit for up to 38 hours of nursing courses. If these hours were not completed prior to the start of the program, students will be required to take elective courses to meet the total of 55 general education hours and 65 nursing hours.
