


ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE NURSING: PARAMEDIC-RN PART-TIME

The part-time paramedic to Registered Nurse (RN) bridge track of the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing is an evening/weekend program designed to build upon the previous experience and coursework of the student. The program prepares students for the National Council Licensing Examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN) and incorporates valuable hands-on opportunities throughout clinical and classroom settings along with individualized instruction from faculty. Upon completing the program, students are prepared to work in a variety of settings and/or transition into a BSN completion program.







Admission Requirements

Direct Admission (students with less than 25 hours of college credit):

- cumulative high school GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale
- cumulative college GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale (if applicable)
- ACT composite score of 21 or SAT score of 1060 (if age 22 or younger)
- minimum one year of Paramedic work experience
- current Paramedic license

OR

Transfer Admission (students with 25 or more completed hours of college credit):

- cumulative college GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale
- minimum one year of paramedic work experience
- current paramedic license

Admission Process

The admission process will not begin until all application materials are received. Materials are not reviewed before this time.

Applications are accepted on a continuous basis. Seats are offered first-come, first-serve to students who meet the above admission requirements until the last Friday in March. At this time, if seats are still available, the program may implement alternative admission criteria.

Applications that are not completed 4 weeks prior to the start of the semester will be rolled over to the next program start date and/or semester.

Cost and Financial Aid

As a part of the admission and enrollment process, students will incur the following costs upfront:

- \$50 application fee
- \$93 CastleBranch fee
- \$100 seat retainer (deposit)
