Progressing Toward Primary Stroke Center Certification

AWARI

The Stroke Care Network awarded St. Claire Regional's Stroke Care Program a "Rising Star" award at its annual summit on June 27 in Lexington, Kentucky. The award recognized SCR's progress towards accreditation as a Primary Stroke Center. SCR is an affiliate hospital in the Stroke Care Network created by UK Comprehensive and Norton Healthcare to develop the first community-based stroke program in the region.

SCR physician and medical director of the Stroke Care Program, Dr. Stephen Damron, said, "There are 24 hospitals in the stroke network at this time, and 4 awarded at the summit meeting. We were recognized

for rapidly making meaningful progress toward accreditation as a Primary Stroke Center. If we continue to collaborate and educate, SCR will reach accreditation in the near future."

As the leading cause of disability and the fourth leading cause of death, stroke kills 137,000 Americans a year (1 in 18 deaths). This year alone, 795,000 Americans will have a new or recurrent stroke, equaling to one stroke every 40 seconds.

Combatting this statistic in our community requires excellent public education, staff training and a commitment to team work at all levels. Cooperation among SCR staff is vital in creating a healthcare team that is dedicated, competent and well educated in providing the best stroke care at SCR.

SCR's Stroke Care Program has created subcommittees within the stroke implementation team to develop better stroke policies, protocols and education for SCR staff and the public.

The Rising Star award recognizes the progress made with SCR's Stroke Care Program and the commitment of our stroke team members, along with being a milestone in the program's journey towards accreditation as a Primary Stroke Center.
