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## Two SCR Staff Members Recognized as Outstanding Preceptors

Jean Jones, MS, RD, CDE, MLDE, Manager, Clinical Nutrition Services and Mike Montes, Director, Food Services, were recently voted Outstanding Clinical Preceptor and Outstanding Food Service Management Preceptor by UK's Department of Dietetics and Human Nutrition for their roles in facilitating and mentoring UK Dietetic students during rotations at St. Claire Regional.

When UK dietetic interns take part in the program, they go through two different rotations at SCR; food service management and clinical nutrition. Each rotation lasts 12 weeks, with each intern totaling 24 weeks at SCR. Jean serves as the preceptor of the clinical nutrition rotation and Mike serves as the preceptor for the rotation in food service management. During the rotations, Jean and Mike help guide the students as they learn to put their knowledge into practice.

Jean has been a clinical preceptor at SCR for 29 years. SCR already participated in internship programs when she first began and it was part of her job to provide education to dietetic interns. Each year, Jean has at least four interns from the University of Kentucky and one from Eastern Kentucky University.

"I love my interns! Serving as a preceptor is one of the best, most fulfilling parts of my job. I enjoy watching them grow, gain confidence and become independent in their work. Each intern I have teaches me something new," said Jean.

This was the first year that Mike has been a preceptor with the program and he has already mentored two UK students. He is currently the preceptor for a student from EKU. The "Valentine's Day" and "Taste of Asia" themed lunches in SCR's cafeteria this year were both products of UK interns

# Reducing Paper

## & PRINTING COSTS

Recently the Value Analysis Council discussed SCR paper consumption and ways to effectively reduce it. The volume and usage cost is quite staggering, so the purpose of this article is to provide staff with information to consider that could make us more efficient. ***Here are some highlighted associated costs not readily visualized when printing.***

- Paper costs approximately .007 cents per page.
- It doesn't sound like much, but SCR spends \$82,513.37 on paper per year.
- Standard black and white printing costs may vary from less than 1 cent to 8 cents per page, depending on the type and model of the machine.
- Color copy costs range from 10 cents to more than \$1.00 depending on the type and model of machine.
- Copiers are the least expensive machine to operate, followed by laser printers. Ink jet printers and fax machines typically make very expensive copies.
- At SCR, once a PHI document is printed, it must be handled with special procedures to insure privacy. These procedures obviously come at a cost.
- Our cost for disposal of PHI and private medical documents is approximately \$30,000 per year.
- Reduction in paper use will also lower our PHI disposal costs.

There are many easy and effective ways to reduce paper usage and also minimize our printing costs. Everyone at SCR has the ability to individually and departmentally conserve paper or reduce overall printing costs.

Reducing the amount of paper we use can save resources and money. ***Here are some things to consider before printing and photocopying:***

- Print only when necessary and only the pages that you need. Don't automatically click the "Print" button.
- Cancel any documents sent to print in error.
- Preview your printing to make sure everything will come out as you want - to reduce reprints.
- Print on both sides of the sheet.
- Use smaller margins and font size and change the default margin settings on your word processor.
- Laminate or use plastic sleeves for documents if it will keep you from printing multiple copies.
- Do NOT use cover sheets.
- Store information electronically and reduce storage space needs. Instead of printing documents to file in a cabinet, create folders on your computer and save information there.
- Use email or fax from PC rather than printing and faxing documents.
- Create fewer handouts:
- When possible, use projectors and PowerPoints instead of making copies for meetings.
- Consider emailing announcements, fliers, and memos instead of sending paper copies.
- Print in black and white rather than color if possible.
- Use the appropriate machine to make copies or print: Use a copier as first option and then a laser printer to print documents.
- Use fax machines for sending documents only.
- Eliminate ink jet printers, which may cost more than \$1.00 per page for color copies or 10 cents for black and white.

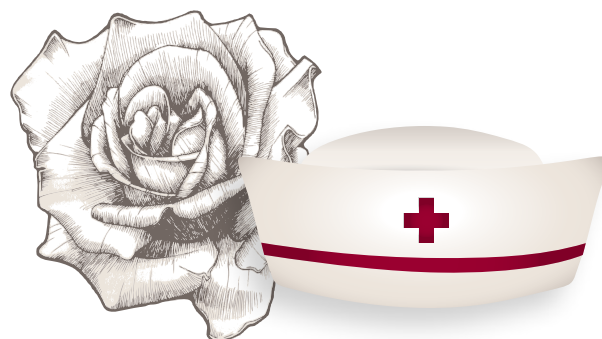
