Reducing Paper

- Paper costs approximately .007 cents per page.
- It doesn't sound like much, but SCR spends \$82,513.37 on paper per year.
- Standard black and white printing costs may vary from less than 1 cent to 8 cents per page, depending on the type and model of the machine.
- Color copy costs range from 10 cents to more than \$1.00 depending on the type and model of machine.
- Copiers are the least expensive machine to operate, followed by laser printers. Ink jet printers and fax machines typically make very expensive copies.
- At SCR, once a PHI document is printed, it must be handled with special procedures to insure privacy. These procedures obviously come at a cost.
- Our cost for disposal of PHI and private medical documents is approximately \$30,000 per year.
- Reduction in paper use will also lower our PHI disposal costs.

& PRINTING COSTS

There are many easy and effective ways to reduce paper usage and also minimize our printing costs. Everyone at SCR has the ability to individually and departmentally conserve paper or reduce overall printing costs.

Reducing the amount of paper we use can save resources and money. *Here are some things to consider before printing and photocopying:*

- Print only when necessary and only the pages that you need. Don't automatically click the "Print" button.
- Cancel any documents sent to print in error.
- Preview your printing to make sure everything will come out as you want to reduce reprints.
- Print on both sides of the sheet.
- Use smaller margins and font size and change the default margin settings on your word processor.
- Laminate or use plastic sleeves for documents if it will keep you from printing multiple copies.
- Do NOT use cover sheets.
- Store information electronically and reduce storage space needs. Instead of printing documents to file in a cabinet, create folders on your computer and save information there.
- Use email or fax from PC rather than printing and faxing documents.
- Create fewer handouts:
- When possible, use projectors and PowerPoints instead of making copies for meetings.
- Consider emailing announcements, fliers, and memos instead of sending paper copies.
- Print in black and white rather than color if possible.
- Use the appropriate machine to make copies or print: Use a copier as first option and then a laser printer to print documents.
- Use fax machines for sending documents only.
- Eliminate ink jet printers, which may cost more than \$1.00 per page for color copies or 10 cents for black and white.

ICU Delirium and Implementation of the ABCDE Bundle
