





In May 1985, Dr. Gordy Klatt walked and ran for 24 hours around a track in Tacoma, Washington, ultimately raising \$27,000 to help the American Cancer Society fight the nation's biggest health concern - cancer. A year later, 340 supporters joined the overnight event. Since those first steps, the Relay For Life movement has grown into a worldwide phenomenon, raising more than \$4 billion to fight cancer.

ABOUT LASER VEIN TREATMENT

In laser vein treatment, a thin fiber is inserted into the damaged vein. A laser light is emitted through the fiber, delivering just the right amount of energy. The targeted tissue reacts with the light energy, causing the vein to close and seal shut. The veins that are closed off are superficial veins that handle less than 5% of your blood flow. The blood is automatically routed to other veins.

THE PROCEDURE IS DONE RIGHT IN THE PHYSICIAN'S OFFICE

The procedure typically lasts anywhere from 45 minutes to one hour, and requires only a local anesthetic. Your physician will insert a thin laser fiber into the vein through a very small entry point, and the laser light that emits through this fiber will seal the faulty vein.

IMMEDIATE RESULTS

After treatment, the appearance of the abnormal vein is instantly improved with minimal-to-no scarring. There may be some slight swelling and minimal bruising around the treatment site. However, once that subsides, patients will see a significant difference in the appearance of your legs.

Community Attitudes & Research Education Study

Mary Horsley, RN, of St. Claire Regional Medical Center along with Jeff Carrico, PharmD, BCPS, of the University of Kentucky, and Kentucky Clinical Trials Network is conducting a research study to evaluate attitudes towards participation in clinical trials amongst Kentuckians.

Eligible participants will be 18 years of age or older and include either:

- Cancer Patients or
- Community Volunteers (those without a cancer diagnosis)

- You will then complete a second survey and seal your answers in a color -coded unmarked envelope.
- You will give both sealed envelopes to the study team.

Total time of participation is approximately 40-50 minutes. Refreshments will be provided as well as \$20 to offset the costs for your time and travel.


