### ST. CLAIRE REGIONAL UPGRADES NETWORK INFRASTRUCTURE

SCR's information technology department is currently workingtoupgradethefacility's network infrastructure in preparation for the Meditech Health Information system implementation.

The network upgrade fulfils several purposes with the simplest being to refresh outdated equipment. The new infrastructure will have the ability to reach network speeds 10 times faster than the existing equipment and will have a better error recovery – which means higher reliability.

The addition of a hospital wide wireless network will be the most visual benefit of the network infrastructure upgrade. The medical center will begin to see an influx of wireless capable devices, such as tablets and mobile carts. This will make it possible for clinical staff to fulfill their duties while mobile. The wireless system will also allow the medical center to provide wireless internet for our patients and their families.

The Meditech Health Information System which includes electronic medical records requires that an enterprise class wireless system be installed throughout the medical center. The enterprise class wireless system utilizes the newest standard of wireless technology as it



not only provides increased speed and coverage but it can be centrally managed and monitored as well.

Other key benefits of the network infrastructure upgrade are reliability and security. The new core switches offer a true redundancy that we currently do not have. If one switch fails the other one takes over without interruption to the end user. The complete infrastructure upgrade, from wired to wireless gives us the ability to have advanced

security features to protect both the network and end user. The infrastructure upgrade puts into place the requirements necessary to expand into new services and technologies.

"With the combination of the network infrastructure upgrade, the installation of the data center, and the implementation of Meditech Health Information system, St. Claire Regional has taken a huge step forward to become an enterprise class technological center" says Mike Williams, SCR Network Analyst. "Overall this new system will be a great asset to St. Claire Regional and our development toward faster and more reliable health care."

St. Claire Regional offered free community health screenings Wednesday, May 19th at Carter County Senior Center in Grayson KY. Senior citizens from Grayson and Olive Hill enjoyed a variety of free general health screenings. During May's flooding the new senior center in Olive Hill, where the event was originally scheduled, received significant flood damage and is being renovated. Seniors from Olive Hill have been riding a bus to the Grayson Center for daily activities and were looking so forward to the screening event they asked our staff to come to Grayson.

Many SCR departments participated in the event. SCR Family Medicine in Olive Hill offered blood pressure, pulse, and oxygen screenings. The lab provided cholesterol and glucose screenings. Sleep assessments were completed by the sleep lab and St. Claire Counseling presented grief and stress management education. DermaScans were done by AHEC and balance screenings were completed by the outpatient rehabilitation unit. SCR Family Medical Supply also provided information and demonstrations on new products available at the retail store.

Bone density screenings were provided by diagnostic imaging services. The diagnostic imaging staff is now performing Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) at community health screenings. ABI screens the adequacy of the circulation in participants' legs.

All participants were very appreciative of the screening event and of all our SCR staff who assisted. The medical center has been invited back in the fall to give the Senior Center and their participants an opportunity to work on getting healthier!
