


The grant will be used by the committee to implement a

This program gives primary care providers access to tools and resources, as well as a proven and evidence-based roadmap to delivering effective, measured care to patients suffering from chronic pain. This opportunity also allows the committee to earn a maintenance of certification improvement in medical practice credit from the American Board of Medical Specialties.

Wendy Fletcher, DNP, APRN, SCH Clinical Director of Advanced Practice and CSSC Co-Chair, will serve as quality improvement lead and develop measures and reporting as it relates to the project. John Sanders, MD, SCH Medical Director of Hospice and Palliative Care, will serve as the project's on-site clinical champion.


