# Barrio San Jorge Community

Residents of the Barrio San Jorge Community faced a severe water crisis. For years, families collected water from a distribution system. While the system provided reliable access to water, the water was unfiltered and contaminated. Consequently, community members battled waterborne diseases and struggled to stay healthy. Children were especially vulnerable and suffered from stomach pains and diarrhea. Then, without warning, the tap stands' flow dropped significantly, leading to a multitude of problems. Water became available only during certain times of year and families struggled to meet even their most basic needs. Suddenly, residents had to seek out alternative sources of water, taking up significant time from their daily routines.

With no options nearby, families traveled to neighboring communities to find water. Sometimes, they purchased safe water from vendors, but doing so regularly caused financial strain. Other times, vendors couldn't be found, and families were forced to gather from open ponds and streams. When residents returned home after walking long distances and carrying home full jerry cans, they had little time or energy for anything else. Despite these burdens, families persevered and held onto hope that things could get better.

Desperate for a sustainable solution, community leaders came together to see what they could do about the situation. When they heard about the work that Living Water International was doing in the area, they reached out for support. Living Water Honduras responded by drilling a borehole and installing a new hand pump just steps away from residents' homes. At last, thanks to your incredible generosity, these 350 men, women, and children can enjoy reliable access to safe water!

Our work will be conducted in partnership with local governments, communities, institutions, and other NGOs, while spreading hope through safe water and the *living water* of Jesus Christ.
