Code Platoon

DRW has forged a meaningful, multi-faceted partnership with Code Platoon for almost ten years. Code Platoon is a nonprofit organization that focuses on transforming veterans and military spouses into tech leaders through intensive coding bootcamps in Full-Stack Software Engineering and Dev Ops/Cloud Engineering. DRW invests time mentoring participants, sharing industry insights, and hosting an apprentice from three platoons each year. To date, DRW has hired 19 apprentices into full-time tech roles across a variety of teams, including Infrastructure Development, Unified Platform, and Marketing & Communications. This partnership celebrates Code Platoon's trailblazing efforts in paving new career pathways for veterans, ensuring they have the skill sets and opportunities to succeed in the civilian workforce.

Greenwood Project

In Summer 2024, DRW hosted two Greenwood Project Scholars as interns within our LRN pipeline. The full LRN Program offers a rotational experience for recent graduates to gain experience on multiple middle and back-office teams which can include Global Trading Operations, Treasury, Risk, Credit, Business Management, Finance, and Project Management. These internship experiences exposed Greenwood Project Scholars to a comprehensive, behind-thescenes understanding of our trading support functions, setting the stage for them to secure competitive roles post-graduation and thrive in their future careers.



LEAD Internship

In Summer 2024, DRW's Community Investment team proudly participated in the Cleveland Avenue Foundation for Education (CAFE) LEAD Program, a distinguished Chicago-based initiative that connects college sophomores with impactful internships, nurturing the next generation of change-makers in education and philanthropy. We offer this opportunity exclusively to current participants and alum of DRW Community Investment Partner Organizations, and were thrilled to welcome Micheal Brown, a rising sophomore at Howard and a proud alum of The Bloc, to the firm. Micheal's remarkable contributions during his internship not only made a significant impact at DRW but also earned him the prestigious Diane Fahey Award, an honor bestowed upon the intern who excels both within the CAFE group and their internship placement.

Technical Apprenticeship Program

This innovative program serves as a powerful re-skilling initiative, offering motivated individuals the chance to pivot into technology careers without needing a traditional 4-year degree or formalized tech background. In partnership with Apprenti, we source exceptional talent in Chicago, focusing on harnessing local potential. With comprehensive training, dedicated mentorship, and exposure to rotations in diverse teams, each apprentice is equipped to excel in full-time tech roles within DRW and the broader tech industry.

Externships Program

In Spring 2024, DRW hosted 5 college student externs – 4 from Bottom Line and 1 from Noble's Alumni network. These externs participated in group activities together focused on leadership development. 4 Externs received exposure to a variety of mid-office and back-office roles as they shadowed analysts in our Leadership Rotation Network (LRN), and another extern shadowed the Community Investment Team. This experience not only broadened the extern's professional horizons but also underscored DRW's commitment to nurturing future leaders and fostering community engagement.

My time at DRW not only helped me build connections with professionals there and strengthen my resume, but most importantly, it significantly boosted my confidence. Noble DRW College Prep

DRW launched a partnership with Noble DRW College Prep in 2012, in 2024, Noble DRW College Prep launched a Ninth Grade Academy model for all students entering their first year. The Ninth Grade Academy involves comprehensive programming to specifically support 9th grade students with their transition from middle to high school. The goal is to provide a smooth transition and prepare ninth grade students for academic and social success, and the academy model is already producing optimistic outcomes, with DRW College Prep performing above Noble network averages on critical academic milestones.



CalTech Gift

In 2024, DRW launched a \$2 Million investment in Caltech's Division of Physics, Mathematics, and Astronomy significant support to advance machine learning and artificial intelligence, Under the leadership of Sergei Gukov, John D. MacArthur Professor of Theoretical Physics and Mathematics, a team consisting of postdoctoral fellows, research scientists, software engineers, and students aim to achieve breakthroughs in mathematical theory previously deemed beyond human capability. By striving to develop artificial general intelligence that mirrors human intuition and innovation, DRW and Caltech are poised to revolutionize problem-solving across various practical applications. This generous investment not only accelerates current research but also nurtures the next generation of leaders in this transformative, cutting-edge area.

Global Giving Challenge

DRW's Giving Challenge is an annual initiative where the firm comes together to give back to the communities where we live and work. All DRW employees are eligible to participate by donating to a nonprofit organization of their choice, leveraging DRW's employer match to double their impact. In 2024, over the course of 3 weeks, 39% of DRW employees participated in the 2024 Giving Challenge and raised \$634,899 for 750 charitable organizations worldwide—86% more than last year, making 2024 the most successful Giving Challenge yet!

Rescuing Leftover Cuisine

DRW launched a partnership with Rescuing Leftover Cuisine to support their mission of reducing food waste and combating hunger. Through this collaboration, DRW actively participates in food rescue operations, redirecting surplus meals to local communities and nonprofit organizations. By nurturing both community resources and sustainable practices, we believe the partnership with RLC is one small step toward building a brighter future where all communities across the city of Chicago have access to food.



Future Frontiers

In Fall 2024, DRW launched a strategic partnership with Future Frontiers, a Londonbased education non-profit dedicated to unlocking the potential of students from underrepresented backgrounds through personalized career coaching and mentoring programs. Thirteen DRW employees in the London office-ranging from Traders and Software Engineers to Relationship Managers and Recruiters - served as coaches to fifteen Year 10 students from Nower Hill High School, collectively providing 75 hours of impactful coaching throughout the program. This engagement led to remarkable outcomes, with 93% of participating students agreeing that their career coaches guided them to discover inspirational careers and provided them with a clearer understanding of the steps needed to achieve their ambitions. By leveraging DRW's expertise and unwavering commitment to shaping the future workforce, the partnership with Future Frontiers empowers students with the skills, insights, and confidence necessary to navigate the complexities of today's job market, fostering a more equitable and dynamic workforce for the future.
