## **Bass Concert Hall**


I will be traveling to

# **Arriving at Bass Concert Hall**



After parking nearby, I will walk to the front of Bass Concert Hall.

It is important to stay with my group since there will be a lot of people attending the performance I am seeing.

# **Entering the Lobby**





I may need to **stand in line** at the front doors to enter the **lobby**. We will scan our mobile tickets on the ticket scanners inside. Then, we will walk through scanners.

If we don't have our tickets yet, we go to the Box Office to get them.






There will be **ushers** dressed in black clothes in the lobby who can assist me. It might be crowded and a little noisy.

Outside food and drink are not allowed in the building, but there will be places in the lobby to purchase them.

### The Restrooms

If I need to use the **restroom**, I will look for the signs to show me the way. There are 2 restrooms located on each floor of the lobby.

It is a good idea to use the restroom **before the show starts** or **during intermission**, so I don't miss anything!





## **Before the Show**





I may need to wait until it is time to open the doors to **enter** the theater. I will **keep my hands and feet to myself** as I am walking in and during the show.





While I am waiting for the show to begin, there are a lot of things to look at. There are many seats in the theater and a stage that will be set up for the show I am about to watch. I will see other audience members, ushers, and staff members.

# **The Show Begins**



When the show is about to **begin**, someone may come onstage to make an announcement, or I may hear an announcement through the speakers.

The **lights will get darker**, and the show will begin.

## **During the Show**

During the show, I might feel different **emotions**: happy, excited, or surprised. I can express those emotions as I am feeling them by smiling or laughing when appropriate.

People may **clap** to show they are enjoying the performance. I can clap during these times too if I want to.



Depending on the performance, there may be an **intermission**. I can stay in my seat, stretch, or go to the lobby during this time.

If I need to leave the theater during the show, I will remember to be respectful of other audience members and exit quietly.





If it gets too loud for me or I need a break during the show, there are some things I can do.

- I can put my headphones on, if I brought them.
- I can cover my ears with my hands.
- I can play with a fidget, if I brought one.
- I can take a break in the lobby.
- I can ask my guardian for help.
- I can go to **Guest Services** located on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor lobby for assistance.

## **After the Show**

After the show, the performers will bow. The audience will clap and sometimes stand to show that they liked the performance. I can stand and clap too if I want.



## **Leaving Bass Concert Hall**

When we are ready to leave, I will **exit** the theater through the same doors that we entered from. Everyone in the theater will be leaving, so it will be crowded and may take some time for us to get out.

I will **stay with my group** as I am leaving the building and going back to my car.
