EXHAUST FAN

Seals additional air through a negative pressure system to better maintain a smoke-free environment. Set up is easy and should be close to a window. ~\$275.00



PRESSURE REGULATOR

Pairs with the air assist, this regulator will help you adjust your psi and also trap any water before going into your air lines. ~\$20



<u>REDUCER</u>

If you upgrade with the exhaust fan previously mentioned, you will also need two of these to connect your machine-hose-fan combo to. ~\$20.00



DUCTING

Though foil ducting comes with the machine, upgrading to this heavy duty rubber duct hose will bring you optimal air flow. ~\$190



AIR ASSIST

My biggest recommendation This keeps dust particles away from the nozzle and can keep engraving AND cuts on surfaces have less "burned" edges. ~\$200



SQUARE/LEVEL

This one was an after-thought; but you will need a square with a flat base to ensure that your laser head can fit flush against it for optimal focus from the beam. ~\$15



BASIC TOOLS

Having access to a basic - i.e., nothing fancy - tool set will keep you prepared for any minor issues that pop up; most that likely won't involve your laser. ~\$40



HEAVY MAGNETS

Having heavy duty magnets is ideal to help keep materials in place on your laser, especially if upgrading the air assist. Additionally, they help flatten bowed wood to keep cutting consistent.

In addition to all of these, just preparing your workspace with ample storage for wood, acrylic and even blank supplies would be smart. AEON is an incredible company and also includes extra items WITH your laser that are not mentioned here, as they are laser specific. Take time to review them, too!
