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## The Renaissance – Causes and Features

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From the 14th century to the end of the 17th century, many European towns experienced growth and the development of a distinct urban culture marked by advances in arts and architecture. The Renaissance, meaning "rebirth," was a cultural movement that began in Italy (1300–1550 CE) and spread across Europe, changing people's thinking and encouraging logic and reasoning. It influenced literature, religion, philosophy, arts, science, and politics.

### Causes of the Renaissance:

- **Decline of Constantinople:** When Constantinople was captured by the Seljuk Turks, artists and scholars fled to Italy, sparking Italian interest in Greek and Roman literature.
- **Decline of Feudalism:** This encouraged intellectual, artistic, and philosophical progress.
- **The Crusades:** Introduced Europeans to new ideas and philosophies of Aristotle and Plato.
- **Growth of Prosperous Trading Community:** Wealthy traders became patrons of art and literature.

- **Royal Patronage:** Kings and queens supported the rise of Renaissance and scientific inventions.
- **Revival of Italian Cities:** Cities like Florence and Venice thrived as independent city-states governed by merchants and bankers.
- **New Trade Routes:** Exploration for luxury goods increased prosperity and trade.
- **Spread of Humanism:** Emphasis on human life and worldly interests over spirituality, denouncing superstitions and promoting human capability.

## Arts and Architecture

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Humanists spread their ideas through arts and architecture, drawing inspiration from ancient Greek and Roman works. The revival of Roman grandeur inspired a new architectural style called the classical style. The invention of the printing press by Johannes Gutenberg in the mid-15th century revolutionized the spread of knowledge, weakening superstitions and dogmas.

The Renaissance also led to growth in vernacular languages and nationalism. Science advanced with figures like Copernicus, Galileo, and Newton challenging traditional beliefs. However, public roles for women remained limited, though some women like Casandra Fedele made intellectual contributions.
