### Section A

**Question 1.** Grief is often seen as a measure of love. Justify your response to Buddha's sermon.

**Answer:** The story of Kisa Gotami, as narrated by Buddha, reflects profound wisdom about grief and love. When she lost her only son, her immense grief showed the depth of her love. Buddha's teachings remain relevant today, helping us understand grief not as weakness but as an expression of love and attachment, while guiding us to accept impermanence and find peace.

**Question 2.** How did the baker become synonymous with celebrations and occasions in Goa? (Glimpses of India)
