

A WORD OR TWO

The purpose of A Word or Two is simply to celebrate language which seems to be fast vanishing from our midst. It could be described as showing what impact the written word can have on impressionable youth and is very much a personal stroll through literature, a literature that has long stirred my imagination and that, for one reason or another, I cannot let go. The poetry and prose I have chosen to accompany my journey are both silly and sad, sacred and profane: ranging from A.A. Milne to the Bible, Shaw and Wilde to Coleridge and Marlowe, W.H. Auden and Nabokov to Rostand and MacLeish, Shakespeare and Byron to Nash and Leacock. It is intended not just to show the myriad of colors words can paint, but to illuminate along the way the several phases of my particular moon. If there must be a "theme," let it be my eternal gratitude to a family who, from the moment I formed my first sentence, made me aware of the joy and magic of language which, after all, is our heritage to hold on to for dear life while we can.

Over the years I have performed this piece in various towns and venues to raise money for the arts and such charities as World Literacy. Since then, I have revised it considerably and it now needs a proper production. In that regard, I'm thrilled that Des McAnuff consented to come on board and add some fresh inspiration. I'm also grateful to the Stratford Festival and Center Theatre Group for providing me the space on which to present it and to you, the audience, without whose presence, there is of course, nothing. Christopher Plummer

CHRISTOPHER PLUMMER

CHRISTOPHER PLUMMER HAS ENJOYED ALMOST 60 YEARS as one of the theatre's most respected actors and as a veteran of over 100 motion pictures. Raised in Montreal, he began his professional career on stage and radio in both French and English. After Eva Le Gallienne gave him his New York debut (1954) he went on to star in many celebrated productions on Broadway and London's West End winning accolades on both sides of the Atlantic. He has won two Tony Awards for the musical Cyrano and for Barrymore plus seven Tony nominations, his latest for his King Lear (2004) and for his Clarence Darrow in Inherit the Wind (2007); also three Drama Desk Awards and the National Arts Club Medal. A former leading member of the Royal National Theatre under Sir Laurence Olivier and the Royal Shakespeare Company under Sir Peter Hall, where he won London's Evening Standard Award for Best Actor in Becket; he has also led Canada's Stratford Festival in its formative years under Sir Tyrone Guthrie and Michael Langham. He is widely recognized as one of the finest classical actors of his time.

Since Sidney Lumet introduced him to the screen in Stage Struck (1958), his range of notable films include The Man Who Would Be King, Battle of Britain, Waterloo, Fall of The Roman Empire, Star Trek VI, Twelve Monkeys and the 1965 Oscar-winning The Sound of Music. More recent credits include The Insider (as Mike Wallace; the National Film Critics Award), the acclaimed A Beautiful Mind, Man in the Chair, Must Love Dogs, National Treasure, Syriana and Inside Man. His TV appearances, which number close to 100, include the Emmy-winning BBC Hamlet at Elsinore playing the title role; the Emmy-winning productions The Thombirds, Nuremberg, Little Moon of Alban and recently HBO's Muhammad Ali's Greatest Fight earning seven Emmy nominations and taking home two Emmys. Mr. Plummer has also written for the stage, television and concert-hall.

Apart from honors in the UK, USA, Austria and Canada, he was the first performer to receive the Jason Robards Award in memory of his great friend, the Edwin Booth Award and the Sir John Gielgud Quill Award. In 1968, sanctioned by Elizabeth II, he was invested as a Companion of the Order of Canada (an honorary knighthood). An Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts at Juilliard, he also received the Governor General's Lifetime Achievement Award in 2000. In 1986 he was inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame and in 2000 Canada's Walk of Fame. His recent self-written memoir, *In Spite of Myself* (Afred A. Knopf Publishers) is being much lauded by critics and public alike.

Plummer's latest projects include the highly praised animated films *Up*, 9 and *My Dog Tulip*, as well as the title role in *The Imaginarium of Doctor Parnassus*, directed by Terry Gilliam. He played the great novelist Tolstoy opposite Helen Mirren in *The Last Station* for Sony Classics where he received his first Academy Award nomination in 2010. He followed that up the next year with another nomination and a win for Best Supporting Actor in *Beginners* from writer/director Mike Mills and appeared in David Fincher's *The Girl with the Dragon Tattoo* that same year. In July and August 2012 he returned to the Stratford Festival to perform his one-man show that he created entitled *A Word or Two* directed by Des McAnuff. Last year, he starred opposite Oscar winner Shirley MacLaine in *Elsa & Fred* directed by Michael Radford, *Hector And His Search for Happiness* directed by Peter Chelsom, *Imagined* opposite Al Pacino and Annette Bening for writer/director Dan Fogelman and *The Forger* opposite John Travolta directed by Phillip Martin.

DES McANUFF (Director) is a two-time Tony Award-winning director and the immediate past Artistic Director of the Stratford Festival. He is also Artistic Director Emeritus of La Jolla Playhouse, where during his tenure he directed more than 30 productions of classics, new plays and musicals. This past year he was awarded Canada's esteemed Governor General's National Arts Centre Award and the Order of Canada. In June 2011 he was honored with a doctorate from Ryerson University and in 2005 he received the prestigious Julia Hansen Award for lifetime achievement in directing. Other New York: Fetch Clay, Make Man (New York Theatre Workshop); The Crazy Locomotive (Chelsea Theater Center); The Death of Von Richtofen As Witnessed From Earth, Henry IV Part 1, Mary Stuart and Leave It to Beaver Is Dead (Public Theater). Stratford Highlights: A Word or Two, Caesar and Cleopatra, The Tempest (all with Christopher Plummer). Opera: Faust (Metropolitan Opera, English National Opera). Film: Cousin Bette (director), The Adventures of Rocky and Bullwinkle (director), Iron Giant (producer) and Quills (executive producer). Upcoming Projects: Billy Crystal's 700 Sundays on HBO, Dr. Zhivago, Tommy, Yoshimi Battles the Pink Robots, and Senna at the Metropolitan Opera.

ROBERT BRILL (Set Designer). For CTG: Bloody Bloody Andrew Jackson, Romance, Another American: Asking and Telling, The First Picture Show and Twilight: Los Angeles, 1992. His Broadway designs include the set and club design for Cabaret, Jesus Christ Superstar, Assassins (Tony nomination), Guys and Dolls (Tony nomination), Design for Living, Buried Child and others. Other collaborations with Des McAnuff include the Flaming Lips musical Yoshimi Battles the Pink Robots (La Jolla Playhouse), Sideways (LIP), Faust (Met Opera/ENO), Wozzeck (SD Opera), Sinatra (Radio City). His other designs for opera include four world premieres: Doubt (Minnesota Opera), Moby-Dick for The Dallas

Opera and other companies throughout the U.S., Australia and Canada, and upcoming Cold Mountain and The Manchurian Candidate. Other credits include White Noise (Chicago), Robin and the Seven Hoods (Old Globe), On the Record (Disney), American in Paris (Boston Ballet), Clockwork Orange (Steppenwolf) and The Laramie Project for BAM and other theatres throughout the U.S. He is a founding member of Sledgehammer Theatre and a recipient of the Merritt Award for Excellence in Design and Collaboration.

MICHAEL WALTON (Lighting Designer). Recent credits include Cosi Fan Tutte (Canadian Opera Company); Maria Stuarda (Pacific Opera); Albert Herring (Vancouver Opera/Pacific Opera); Fiddler on the Roof, Othello, The Three Musketeers, Henry V, The Matchmaker, A Word or Two, Twelfth Night, The Misanthrope, The Tempest (starring Christopher Plummer), As You Like It, King of Thieves, Macbeth, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Hamlet (Stratford Festival); Yoshimi Battles the Pink Robots, Sideways (La Jolla Playhouse); Venus in Fur, Cruel and Tender (Canadian Stage); 'night, Mother (Soulpepper); Next to Normal (TC/Citadel); The Rocky Horror Show, The Three Musketeers, Little Women (Citadel Theatre); And Slowly Beauty (Belfry/NAC/Tarragon); The Year of Magical Thinking (Belfry/NAC/ Tarragon). MICHAEL ROTH (Composer) is a composer, musician and sound designer whose work encompasses film, opera, chamber music, and especially theatre (over 250 productions). Recent Projects: at the Stratford Festival, The Tempest (with Christopher Plummer), Twelfth Night, both filmed for Bravo; the documentary Jews & Baseball (PBS); many productions as resident composer at La Jolla Playhouse and South Coast Repertory including premieres of Mr. Marmalade, Wit, A Walk In The Woods (also Broadway), Dinner With Friends (also off-Broadway, directed by Daniel Sullivan), Culture Clash's The Birds, Sideways and The Whale; many collaborations with Randy Newman, including music direction/arrangements for Princess & The Frog (Disney animated feature), Harps & Angels (CTG), Faust, Education Of Randy Newman (SCR,

ACT) and editing five songbooks; and collaborations with, among many others, Anne Bogart, Sarah Ruhl, Peter Sellars, Carey Perloff, Tom Stoppard (U.S. premieres: Indian Ink, Invention Of Love), the UN, and accompanying singers from Marni Nixon to Alice Ripley and Alicia Keys. Upcoming: Fats November (new piano sonata) and his chamber/string quartet treatment of Beckett's Imagination Dead Imagine. PETER McBOYLE (Sound Designer). One of Canada's busiest sound designers, Peter has worked at most of the major theatres in Canada and in U.S. cities such as New York, Las Vegas and Atlanta. He has had a long history with The Stratford Festival where he has spent 18 seasons and designed over 50 productions. Throughout his career he has had the privilege of working with artists such as Christopher Plummer, Twyla Tharp, Des McAnuff, Gary Griffin, Antoni Cimolino, Stafford Arima and Brian Dennehy. His Broadway credits include Come Fly Away and Barrymore and his national tours include West Side Story, Catch Me If You Can, Come Fly Away and Legally Blonde. Peter has a master's degree in Music Technology from McGill University (Montréal). Originally from Toronto, he now lives in Stratford, Ontario, with his wife Meghan, and their daughters, Ella and Beatrice.

THE STRATFORD FESTIVAL is North America's leading classical theatre, attracting almost half a million visitors annually to its four theatres in Stratford, Ontario, Canada. With William Shakespeare as its foundation. the Festival presents a seven-month repertory season of 12 or more new productions, featuring classics both ancient and modern, musicals and new work. Under the leadership of Artistic Director Antoni Cimolino and Executive Director Anita Gaffney, each season also features The Forum, a program of more than 150 events to allow patrons to delve further into the issues raised by our plays. The Festival's mission includes development of Canadian theatre artists, through initiatives such as the intensive Birmingham Conservatory for Classical Theatre for actors and the Michael Langham Workshop for Classical Direction. The Festival has toured internationally since its 1956 Broadway production of Tamburlaine the Great, and in 1998 its productions of Much Ado About Nothing and The Miser performed in repertory at New York's City Center. Broadway transfers of its productions of King Lear starring Christopher Plummer (2004), The Importance of Being Earnest starring Brian Bedford (2011) and Jesus Christ Superstar (2012) have received Tony Award nominations. Other recent productions, including The Tempest, starring Mr. Plummer, and Twelfth Night, featuring Brian Dennehy, both directed by Des McAnuff, have been filmed for theatrical release and are available on DVD. FOR CENTER THEATRE GROUP

MICHAEL RITCHIE (Artistic Director) is in his eighth season as Center Theatre Group's Artistic Director, and has led over 130 productions to the Ahmanson, Taper and Douglas stages since his arrival in 2005. From 1996 to 2004 Michael was the Producer of the Williamstown Theatre Festival and

prior to that he was a Production Stage Manager in NYC. At CTG, he premiered six musicals that moved to Broadway— The Drowsy Chaperone (which won 13 Tony Award® nominations), Curtains (eight Tony nominations) 13, 9 to 5: The Musical, Bloody Bloody Andrew Jackson and Leap of Faith. He has produced 33 world premieres including the musicals Minsky's, Venice and Sleeping Beauty Wakes, and the plays Bengal Tiger at the Baghdad Zoo (a Pulitzer Prize finalist that also moved to Broadway), Water & Power and Yellow Face, and he presented a broad range of plays and musicals ranging from Dead End to The Black Rider to Edward Scissorhands to blockbusters such as God of Carnage, Mary Poppins, Jersey Boys and August: Osage County. In addition, Michael inaugurated CTG's New Play Production Program, designed to foster the development and production of new work.

EDWARD L. RADA (Managing Director) returned to Center Theatre Group in 2011 after previously serving as CTG's Chief Financial Officer for 12 years (1996-2008). Rada spent three years (2008-2011) as President of the Music Center Foundation, a non-profit corporation that holds and invests the endowment and reserve funds for the Music Center and its resident companies (including CTG). Prior to his years at CTG, he was the Director of Finance at The Old Globe in San Diego and principal of Rada & Associates, an accounting firm that specialized in entertainment-related non-profit organizations and theatrical productions. He is a graduate of Occidental College in Los Angeles with numerous post-graduate coursework and credentials. He currently serves on the board of directors for Entertainment Industry Foundation, Theatre @ Boston Court, and United Support of Artists for Africa/USA for Africa, among other affiliations. He also serves on the board of trustees for the pension, health and welfare and 401(k) plans of I.A.T.S.E. Local 33 Stagehands Union.

DOUGLAS C. BAKER (Producing Director) is now in his 23rd season at CTG. Previously, he managed Broadway and touring productions including Tru, Born Yesterday, The Gospel at Colonus, Annie, A Chorus Line, Working, The Wiz, and Legends!, which premiered at the Ahmanson Theatre in 1986 and starred Mary Martin and Carol Channing. Doug is a member of the Achievement Hall of

Fame of Chagrin Falls Schools in Ohio and a graduate of Albion College. He is an active member of the Broadway League, the Independent Presenters Network and is a proud member of the Association of Theatrical Press Agents and Managers. In May 2013 Doug received The Broadway League's prestigious Outstanding Achievement in Presenter Management Award.

JEFFREY UPAH (General Manager, Ahmanson Theatre) has worked in management at Center Theatre Group since 2006 on more than 50 musicals, plays and special events including both pre-Broadway productions and Broadway tours. Some of his favorites include Follies, God of Carnage and The Black Rider (having previously worked on Robert Wilson productions in Boston, Houston and São Paulo, Brazil). Prior to CTG, he was the marketing manager for the last two of his 11 seasons with The Santa Fe Opera, and worked in various capacities at Yale Repertory Theatre, American Repertory Theatre and Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, among others. He graduated magna cum laude with his studies in film and theatre from Washington University in St. Louis, and received an MFA in theatre management from the Yale School of Drama.

GORDON DAVIDSON (Founding Artistic Director) led the Taper throughout its first 38 seasons, guiding over 300 productions to its stage and winning countless awards for himself and the theatre—including the Tony Award® for theatrical excellence, Margo Jones Award, The Governor's Award for the Arts and a Guggenheim fellowship. The Kentucky Cycle and Angels in America (Part One) won the Pulitzer in consecutive years and, in 1994, three of the four plays nominated for the Tony Award® for Best Play were from the Taper (Angels in America won). In 1989 Gordon took over the Ahmanson and, in 2004, he produced the inaugural season in the Kirk Douglas Theatre.
