# CENTER THEATRE GROUP'S 54th SEASON AT THE AHMANSON THEATRE TO BEGIN NOVEMBER 30, 2021 WITH MATTHEW WARCHUS DIRECTED "A CHRISTMAS CAROL"

#### Ahmanson Theatre Will Have Been Dark For 20 Months

Artistic Director Michael Ritchie announced Center Theatre Group's 54th season at the Ahmanson Theatre will begin November 30, 2021, three months later than it was most recently scheduled and 20 months after the theatre closed in March of 2020. The season opens with director Matthew Warchus' acclaimed "A Christmas Carol." The season includes the previously announced productions of "The Lehman Trilogy," "The Prom," "Hadestown" and "Dear Evan Hansen" plus "Come From Away" (Please Note: "Come From Away" was originally announced for the season but was postponed in the most recent season update—it will now return to the season with new performance dates). In addition, the season will include the hit West End musical, "Everybody's Talking About Jamie." The Tony Award-winning Best Revival "Rogers and Hammerstein's Oklahoma!" which was previously set to open the season in August of 2020 will now close the season in 2022. The previously announced production of "1776" will be postponed until a future season. For a full schedule of the 2021 – 2022 season, please see the final pages of the release.

"It feels like ages ago that theatres across the world went dark and, in many ways, it has been," said Center Theatre Group Artistic Director Michael Ritchie. "But, with vaccination rates going up, infection rates falling, and all of us cautiously returning to museums, movie theaters, restaurants and even stadiums, we can finally see the moment when the curtain will rise again at the Ahmanson.

"We will open the subscription season with a boldly reimagined classic in director Matthew Warchus' production of 'A Christmas Carol' which dazzled audiences on Broadway and at London's Old Vic and promises to offer a celebratory return for Ahmanson audiences.

"Next up is an exciting new hit musical from London's West End, 'Everybody's Talking About Jamie,' about a young man finding himself and his spotlight. And the season continues with 'The

Lehman Trilogy,' a stunningly beautiful epic directed by Oscar winner Sam Mendes which follows nearly two centuries in the lives of an immigrant family that both defined and threatened to destroy the American dream.

"We are proud to present two Tony-winning Best Musicals with Anaïs Mitchell and Rachel Chavkin's truly original telling of ancient Greek myths in 'Hadestown,' as well as a fan favorite, 'Dear Evan Hansen,' which returns after a record-breaking, six-week engagement in 2018. Also back by popular demand is the Tony-winning musical 'Come From Away' which speaks so directly to our need to come together as a community.

"We also welcome back Bob Martin and Casey Nicholaw, who collaborated on 'The Drowsy Chaperone' when it made its U.S. premiere at the Ahmanson in 2005. Bob and Casey return with their newest production, a big-hearted Broadway musical, 'The Prom.'

"And finally, we conclude this long-awaited season with 'Oklahoma!' It's a true Broadway classic made even more vital by Daniel Fish's bold reimagining."

Ritchie continued, "For the first time in a very long while we are seeing a light at the end of the tunnel and can properly plan for a full return to our three stages. We already announced 'Slave Play' at the Mark Taper Forum and 'Tambo & Bones' at the Douglas and are currently working to assemble the full season at both of those venues. I look forward to announcing those seasons in the coming months and, in light of rapidly developing good news from state officials, we are continuing to search for nontraditional productions and other opportunities to return to the stage more quickly than our subscription seasons would generally allow. In the meantime, we will continue to create and present an eclectic collection of virtual productions on our Digital Stage and rebuild our organization in preparation for the return of live theatre.

"Of course, as excited as we all are to end this unprecedented intermission, we know we have to proceed cautiously with the safety of our artists and audiences as our highest priority. Working with the state, the county and The Music Center, we have already made remarkable progress and I have no doubt that we will be ready when the curtain rises again."

## "Everybody's Talking About Jamie"

The Ahmanson season continues with the North American premiere of the hit West End musical "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" at the Ahmanson from January 16 through February 20, 2022. The opening date will be announced at a later date.

Inspired by a true story, winner of three WhatsOnStage Awards including Best New Musical and nominated for five Olivier Awards, this funny, fabulous musical sensation has thrilled audiences and critics alike since opening in 2017. Fresh and contemporary with an extraordinary mother and son relationship at its center, "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" celebrates acceptance, belonging, the power of unconditional love of a mother for her child and how good life is when everybody is the best they can be.

Jamie New is sixteen and lives in public housing in Sheffield, England. Jamie doesn't quite fit in, he's terrified about the future and he's going to be a sensation. Inspired by a true story, "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" is an award-winning hit musical for today. Supported by his loving mum and surrounded by his friends, Jamie overcomes prejudice, beats the bullies and steps out of the darkness, into the spotlight. With catchy songs by Dan Gillespie Sells, lead singer-songwriter of UK rock band The Feeling, and book and lyrics by writer Tom MacRae.

Director Jonathan Butterell saw the Firecracker documentary film "Jamie: Drag Queen at 16" the true story of Jamie Campbell and his mother, Margaret. This inspired him to create this musical which is a dramatized portrayal of a period in Jamie's life but is not a faithful account. Certain events and characters have been fictionalized.

"Everybody's Talking About Jamie" features design by Anna Fleischle, choreography by Kate Prince, lighting design by Lucy Carter, sound design by Paul Groothuis, casting by Will Burton and video design by Luke Hall. The musical supervisor is Theo Jamieson and Richard Weeden is the musical director.

The Sheffield Theatres production of "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" is produced in the West End by Nica Burns, Ian Osborne, Paula Marie Black, Teresa and Craig Beech. "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" opened at the Sheffield Crucible in 2017 before moving to the Apollo Theatre in London's West End. In addition to receiving five-star reviews, "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" has won eight major theatre awards including the UK Theatre and WhatsOnStage Awards for Best New Musical and the Attitude Culture Award 2017, and was nominated for five Olivier Awards. Most recently the show won Best Original Cast Recording at the 2019 WhatsOnStage Awards.

"Everybody's Talking About Jamie" was screened live from the Apollo Theatre into over 500 cinemas across the UK, Ireland and select European territories on July 5, 2018, it was screened in cinemas across the US, Canada and Australia in November of 2018 and there was an encore cinema screening across the UK on January 29, 2019. "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" won the Event Cinema Campaign of the Year at the Screen Awards 2018. The official West End cast recording was released digitally

Dan Gillespie Sells (Music) is best known for being the lead vocalist and principal songwriter in The Feeling. Their debut album, "Twelve Stops And Home" sold over a million copies, whilst their second album, "Join With Us," reached the No. 1 spot in the UK Charts. The band's fifth album was released in March 2016. Before The Feeling, Dan worked as a session musician. Theatrical credits include: "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" (Crucible Theatre with Tom MacRae and Jonathan Butterell), "The Bad, The Sad and The Broken Hearted" (Performed originally at the Soho Theatre and then at The Steve Allen Theatre in Los Angeles. It is currently being developed as a series in America), "3WithD" (Colosseum in London and at the Stuttgart Ballet, a collaboration with Javier De Frutos and Ed Watson), "Beautiful People" (a TV Series Theme Music). Dan was the recipient of the 2015 Stonewall award for Entertainer of the Decade for his work in the LGBT community and the 2007 Ivor Novello Award for Songwriter of the Year.

Tom MacRae (Book and Lyrics) is brand new to theatre, although he has written a lot of TV shows, including "Doctor Who," the Comedy Central sitcom "Threesome" (which he also created) and Sky 1's "Fungus The Bogeyman" which he developed from Raymond Briggs' classic story. He currently lives in Los Angeles where he is working as a writer and producer on US TV drama "The Librarians." Tom is also a children's author and has had three picture books published, including the award winning "The Opposite." "Everybody's Talking About Jamie" marks Tom's debut as a playwright and lyricist and is his first professional collaboration with long-time friend Dan Gillespie Sells.

## "The Lehman Trilogy"

Written by Stefano Massini Adapted by Ben Power Directed by Sam Mendes March 3\* - April 10, 2022

The story of a family and a company that changed the world, told in three parts on a single evening, the National Theatre and Neal Street Productions' critically acclaimed "The Lehman Trilogy" will come to the Ahmanson Theatre March 3\* through April 10, 2022 after sold-out runs at the

National Theatre, in London's West End and at the Park Avenue Armory. "The Lehman Trilogy" is written by Stefano Massini, adapted by Olivier Award-nominated Ben Power and directed by multiple Olivier Award, Tony Award and Oscar winner Sam Mendes ("The Ferryman," "Skyfall," "1917"). Opening date to be announced. (\*Please Note: A previous release listed the first preview as March 1).

"The Lehman Trilogy" weaves through nearly two centuries of Lehman lineage. On a cold September morning in 1844 a young man from Bavaria stands on a New York dockside. Dreaming of a new life in the new world. He is joined by his two brothers and an American epic begins. One hundred and sixty three years later, the firm they establish—Lehman Brothers—spectacularly collapses into bankruptcy and triggers the largest financial crisis in history.

"The Lehman Trilogy" features set designs by Es Devlin, costume design by Katrina Lindsay, video design by Luke Halls and lighting design by Jon Clark. The composer and sound designer is Nick Powell, the co-sound designer is Dominic Bilkey, with music direction by Candida Caldicot and movement by Polly Bennett. The associate director is Zoé Ford Burnett. Casting to be announced.

The world premiere of Stefano Massini's "The Lehman Trilogy" opened at the Piccolo Teatro in Milan in 2015. It turned out to be Artistic Director Luca Ronconi's final production before his death. A long-term admirer of Ronconi's, Sam Mendes was inspired to begin planning an English adaptation for Neal Street Productions.

Ben Power was commissioned by Neal Street Productions to create a new version of this epic play, using a literal English translation by Mirella Cheeseman. This production opened at the National Theatre on July 4, 2018, before its North American premiere at the Park Avenue Armory where it garnered huge critical acclaim. The New York Times called it a "magnificent play... [a] genuinely epic production out of London, directed with surging sweep and fine-tooled precision by Sam Mendes...with a design team that understands the value of simplicity in doing justice to complex matters."

"The Lehman Trilogy" subsequently opened May 11, 2019, for a 16-week sold-out West End run at the Piccadilly Theatre. "The Lehman Trilogy" was in previews on Broadway at the Nederlander Theatre when the pandemic forced theatres to close.

Recent Broadway productions from the National Theatre include "Network" (Tony Award for Best Actor in a Play for Bryan Cranston); "Angels in America," the most nominated play in Tony Award history (three Tony Awards including Best Revival of a Play; Drama Desk Award; Drama League Award; Outer Critics Circle Award); "The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time" (five Tony Awards including Best Play; Drama Desk Award; Drama League Award; Outer Critics Circle Award); and "Hadestown," (eight Tony Awards including Best Musical). Off-Broadway, "People, Places & Things," a co-production with Headlong Theatre, and "The Jungle," a Good Chance Theatre co-production with the National Theatre and the Young Vic, transferred to St. Ann's Warehouse.

Neal Street Productions' recent Broadway hits include "The Ferryman" (four Tony Awards, including Best Play and Best Director of a Play) and film includes "1917," which recently won two Golden Globes for Best Motion Picture and Best Director (Sam Mendes).

Stefano Massini's work has been translated into 22 languages and performed around the world. His plays have been directed by Luca Ronconi, Lluis Pasqual, Arnaud Meunier, Irina Brook, Anton Kouznetsov, Declan Donnellan, Marius von Mayenburg, Stephan Bachmann and Sam Mendes. In 2015 he became the artistic consultant at Piccolo Teatro di Milano/Teatro d'Europa. Stefano Massini is the author of many novels and essays and contributes regularly to Italian newspaper La Repubblica. In film he has collaborated with production companies such as Fandango and Cattleya. He appears weekly on Italian talk show "Piazzapulita" on La7.

Ben Power is a writer for theatre and film and an Associate of the National Theatre where his work includes "Husbands & Sons," "Medea" and "Emperor and Galilean." He has worked as a dramaturg on over 60 productions at the National and ran the temporary theatre, The Shed, during its three years on the South Bank. He was the associate director of Headlong, where his adaptations included "Six Characters in Search of an Author," "Faustus" and "Paradise Lost." Other work for theatre includes "A Tender Thing" for the RSC and dramaturgy on "A Disappearing Number" (Olivier, Evening Standard and Critics' Circle awards for Best Play). Screenplays include five episodes of "The Hollow Crown" (Royal Television Society and Broadcasting Press Guild Award for Best Single Drama; BAFTA nomination for Best Single Drama and Best Mini-Series).

Sam Mendes founded and ran the Donmar Warehouse in London for ten years. He was the founding director of Neal Street Productions and The Bridge Project. His work has been seen at the National Theatre, RSC, Royal Court, Old Vic, Young Vic, BAM, the West End and on Broadway. Films include "American Beauty," "Road to Perdition," "Jarhead," "Revolutionary Road," "Away We Go," "Skyfall," "Spectre" and "1917." Awards include the Academy Award for Best Director and Best Picture and three other Academy Award nominations, five BAFTA Awards, three Golden Globe Awards, two Tony Awards, five Olivier Awards, the Olivier Special Award, three Evening Standard Awards, the PGA award, two Directors Guild of America Awards and the Shakespeare Prize. He has also won the Director's Guild Award for lifetime achievement. He was made a CBE in 2000 and knighted in 2020 for services to drama.

### "Hadestown"

Music, Lyrics and Book by Anaïs Mitchell
Developed with and Directed by Rachel Chavkin

"Hadestown," the winner of eight 2019 Tony Awards including Best Musical and the 2020 Grammy Award for "Best Musical Theater Album," comes to Los Angeles April 26 through May 29, 2022. Opening date to be announced.

Hailed by the Los Angeles Times' Charles McNulty as, "Quite simply one of the most exquisite works of musical storytelling I've seen in my more than 25 years as a theater critic," "Hadestown" is the most honored show of the 2018 – 2019 Broadway season. In addition to the show's Grammy Award and eight Tony Awards, it has been honored with four Drama Desk Awards, six Outer Critics Circle Awards including Outstanding New Broadway Musical and the Drama League Award for Outstanding Production of a Musical.

"Hadestown," the acclaimed new musical by celebrated singer-songwriter and Tony Award winner Anaïs Mitchell and developed with innovative director and Tony Award winner Rachel Chavkin, marks the first time in over a decade that a woman has been the solo author of a Broadway musical: writing the music, lyrics and book, and is the fourth time in Broadway history a woman has accomplished this creative feat.

The show originated as Mitchell's indie theatre project in Vermont that toured North America and the UK and she then turned into an acclaimed album. With Chavkin, her artistic collaborator, "Hadestown" has been transformed into a genre-defying new musical that blends modern American folk music with New Orleans-inspired jazz to reimagine two sweeping ancient tales.

Following two intertwining love stories—that of young dreamers Orpheus and Eurydice, and that of King Hades and his wife Persephone—"Hadestown" invites audiences on a hell-raising journey to the underworld and back. Mitchell's beguiling melodies and Chavkin's poetic imagination pit industry against nature, doubt against faith and fear against love. The 2021-2022 season at the Ahmanson closes with "Rodgers and Hammerstein's Oklahoma!" beginning September 13 and continuing through October 16, 2022. Directed by Daniel Fish and hailed by The New York Times' Ben Brantley as a "wide-awake, jolting and altogether wonderful production of 'Rodgers and Hammerstein's Oklahoma!'" The opening performance will be announced at a later date.

"How is it that the coolest new show on Broadway is a 1943 musical?" asked Brantley. This is "Oklahoma!" as you've never seen or heard it before – reimagined for the 21st century, and now the Tony Award winner for Best Revival of a Musical. Funny and sexy, dark and jolting, this acclaimed production of "Oklahoma!" "lets us experience Rodgers and Hammerstein's greatness anew," said Elisabeth Vincentelli in The New Yorker.

Stripped down to reveal the darker psychological truths at its core, Daniel Fish's production tells a story of a community circling its wagons against an outsider, and the frontier life that shaped America. Upending the sunny romance of a farmer and a cowpoke, this "Oklahoma!" allows the classic musical—and our country—to be seen in a whole new light.

This revival of "Oklahoma!" as originally developed, produced, and premiered at the Richard B. Fisher Center for the Performing Arts at Bard College (Jeanne Donovan Fisher, Chair; Leon Botstein, President; Gideon Lester, Artistic Director; Bob Bursey, Executive Director; Caleb Hammons, Senior Producer) in July 2015, followed by an engagement at St. Ann's Warehouse in Brooklyn, NY, where it had a sold out run in 2018. The Broadway production is helmed by three time Tony-winning lead producer Eva Price ("Dear Evan Hansen," "Angels in America," "Oklahoma!," "What The Constitution Means To Me" and this season's 15-time Tony-nominated "Jagged Little Pill").

After long and highly distinguished careers with other collaborators, composer Richard Rodgers (1902-1979) and librettist/lyricist Oscar Hammerstein II (1895-1960) joined forces to create the most consistently fruitful and successful partnership in American musical theatre. "Oklahoma!," the first Rodgers & Hammerstein musical, was also the first of a new genre—the musical play—representing a

unique fusion of Rodgers' musical comedy and Hammerstein's operetta. A milestone in the development of the American musical, it also marked the beginning of the most successful partnership in Broadway musical history, and was followed by "Carousel," "Allegro," "South Pacific," "The King and I," "Me and Juliet," "Pipe Dream," "Flower Drum Song" and "The Sound of Music." Rodgers & Hammerstein wrote one musical specifically for the big screen, "State Fair," and one for television, "Cinderella." Collectively, the Rodgers & Hammerstein musicals earned 35 Tony Awards, 15 Academy Awards, two Pulitzer Prizes, two Grammy Awards and two Emmy Awards. Despite Hammerstein's death in 1960, Rodgers continued to write for the Broadway stage. Richard Rodgers died on December 30, 1979, less than eight months after his last musical opened on Broadway. In 1990, Broadway's 46th Street Theatre was renamed The Richard Rodgers Theatre in his honor.

Daniel Fish is a New York-based director who makes work across the boundaries of theatre, film and opera. He draws on a broad range of forms and subject matter including plays, film scripts, contemporary fiction, essays and found audio. His 2019 production of "Oklahoma!" transferred to Broadway from St. Ann's Warehouse and won the Tony Award for Best Musical Revival. Other recent work includes "White Noise," inspired by the novel by Don DeLillo (Ruhrfestspiele Recklingshausen, Theater Freiburg and Skirball NYU), Michael Gordon's opera, "Acquanetta" (Prototype Festival), "Don't Look Back" (The Chocolate Factory), "Who Left This Fork Here" (Baryshnikov Arts Center, Onassis Center), Ted Hearne's "The Source" (BAM NEXT WAVE, L.A. Opera, San Francisco Opera) and "Eternal," a video installation. His work has been seen at theatres and festivals throughout the U.S. and Europe including, The Walker Arts Center, PuSH, Teatro Nacional D. Maria, Lisbon/Estoril Film Festival, Vooruit, Festival TransAmériques, Noorderzon Festival, The Chocolate Factory, The Public Theater's Under The Radar, Opera Philadelphia/Curtis Opera Theatre, American Repertory Theater, Richard B. Fisher Center at Bard College, Yale Repertory Theatre, McCarter Theatre, Signature Theatre, The Shakespeare Theatre Company, Düsseldorfer Schauspielhaus, Staatstheater Braunschweig and The Royal Shakespeare Company. Residencies and commissions include The MacDowell Colony, Baryshnikov Arts Center, Mass MOCA, The Chocolate Factory, The Bushwick Starr, LMCC/ Governor's Island. He is graduate of Northwestern University's Department of Performance Studies and has taught at The Juilliard School, Bard College, Princeton University, and The Department of Design for Stage and Film at NYU Tisch School of the Arts.
