

HUMAN FLASHCARD

Objectives

- Students will be introduced to ideas and themes in Alma
- Students will explore their personal and collective connections to these ideas
- Students will create tableaus that express their personal and collective connections to these ideas

Materials needed

• Index cards with a written theme word

Activity

In *Alma*, flashcards are an important prop. There are two sets of flashcards: Angel's with vocabulary words for the SAT exam and Alma's to help her prepare for her citizenship test.

- 1. Invite the students to walk around the space, being mindful not to bump into anyone.
- 2. Share a theme from the play and ask the students to think about what it means to them. On a 10-count, students will stop and strike a tableau – a frozen picture – that represents something about the word for them. Repeat using the following ideas:

<u>Themes</u>: Borders, American Dream, Justice, Immigration, Wishes, Bridges

- 3. Place students in groups of 3-4 and give each group one of the words written on an index card. Ask them to talk about what the word mean to them.
- 4. Invite the students to create a group tableau that represents what the word means to them. They will communicate in the tableau what the theme/idea means to them and how it makes them feel.
- 5. Share: One at a time, give each group a count of 1, 2, 3, frozen picture. Ask the audience: What do you see? What's the feeling? Ask the artists: What is your word? Can you share some of the highlights of your conversation?

While you watch the play *Alma*, notice what these themes and ideas mean to the characters and their lives. Notice what is similar to your thoughts and feelings and what might be very different.
