



Backbeat sticks quite closely to the historical facts, but we have occasionally shifted events and personalities around for dramatic effect. For instance, Stuart Sutcliffe joined the Beatles before Pete Best; Tony Sheridan, whom the Beatles backed on "My Bonnie," was hugely respected by them as a singer, guitarist and all-round wild man; after their first season in Hamburg, the Beatles returned to Liverpool separately, George first, Stuart last; "Love Me Do" was released later than we have suggested in the show. A timeline of the Beatles' career appears on Pages 6 and 7 in the program. And, of course, Paul is left-handed.

The original production of *Backbeat* opened at the Citizens Theatre, Glasgow, on Tuesday, February 9, 2010. This production of *Backbeat* was first performed at the Duke of York's Theatre, London, on Saturday, September 24, 2011.

# 1958

In February, 14-year-old Harrison joins the group.

# 1940

**JUN 23:** Stuart Sutcliffe is born in Edinburgh. The family moves to Liverpool three years later.

JUL 7: Richard Starkey, aka Ringo Starr, is born.

OCT 9: John Lennon is born.

# 1942

JUN 18: Paul McCartney is born.

# 1943

FEB 24: George Harrison is born.

# 1956/57

Sutcliffe and Lennon meet. They are roommates at Liverpool College of Art.

......

Lennon forms the Quarrymen. In July, McCartney is asked to join as guitarist.

# 1958

In February, 14-year-old Harrison joins the group.

# 1960

**JAN:** Lennon persuades Sutcliffe to buy a bass and join the group. The pair re-name the band The Beetles, after Buddy Holly's Crickets. By May they're touring Scotland as The Beatals, then The Silver Beatles, before settling on the Beatles. Pete Best is the drummer.

**AUG:** Start of a 106-night run of gigs in Hamburg: 48 nights at the Indra Club and 58 nights at the Kaiserkeller.

**OCT:** Ringo joins Lennon, McCartney and Harrison onstage for the first time.

**NOV:** Sutcliffe becomes engaged to German photographer Astrid Kirchherr. She helped create the moptop image by cutting Stuart's hair in that style. Harrison, McCartney and Best are all sent back to Liverpool.

# 1961

**MAR:** Sutcliffe quits the band after enrolling at Hamburg's State School of Art. McCartney switches to bass, playing Sutcliffe's right-handed instrument upside down.

DEC: Brian Epstein becomes their manager.

# 1962

**JAN:** The band auditions for Decca, who turns them down, saying "Guitar groups are on the way out." Instead they are signed by George Martin to EMI's Parlophone.

**APR 10:** Sutcliffe dies of a brain hemorrhage. Lennon does not attend the Liverpool funeral, but Yoko Ono says later, "Hardly a day went by that John did not talk about him."

**JUN:** George Martin complains to Epstein about Best's drumming ability. Best is replaced by Ringo.

**OCT:** Debut single "Love Me Do" reaches No. 17 in the charts.

# 1963

MAR: Debut album "Please Please Me" is released and reaches No. 1.

**APR:** First No. 1 single "From Me to You" is released. Beatlemania has begun.

**AUC:** "She Loves You" becomes first Beatles track to sell a million.

# 1964

**FEB:** First U.S. trip including the Ed Sullivan Show watched by 74 million.

APR: The Beatles occupy the entire U.S. Top 5.

**JUN-SEP:** While on the U.S. tour they are introduced to Bob Dylan and cannabis.

JUL: The movie A Hard Day's Night premieres.

# 1965

APR: Lennon and Harrison take their first LSD.

**JUN:** The Queen awards them controversial MBEs. Lennon later returned his as a political protest.

**AUG:** The Beatles play New York's Shea Stadium. Later that month they meet their idol Elvis Presley.

DEC: Rubber Soul released.

# 1966

**AUG:** *Revolver* released. A week later the furor surrounding Lennon's infamous "more popular than Jesus" comment begins.

# 1967

JUN: Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band released. The cover features many famous faces including Stuart Sutcliffe.

**AUG:** Brian Epstein dies while the Beatles are at Maharishi Mahesh Yogi's retreat in Bangor. Lennon said later this was the beginning of the end.

# 1968

**JUN:** The animated film *Yellow Submarine* is released. The album follows seven months later.

**NOV:** *The Beatles* double album, aka *The White Album*, is released. It reflects growing tension, including Lennon's insistence on bringing Yoko Ono to sessions.

# 1969

**JAN:** Last live performance on the roof of the Apple Corp building in London.

**SEP 20:** Lennon tells the others he's quitting, but will delay the public announcement. Six days later *Abbey Road* is released.

# 1970

**APR 10:** McCartney publicly quits. **MAY:** *Let It Be* is released.

**DEC 31:** McCartney files a lawsuit to dissolve the partnership.

He continues to act as an independent film producer; the most recently released project with David Parfitt, his colleague from Renaissance for Trademark Films, is A Bunch Of Amateurs by Ian Hislop and Nick Newman, featuring Derek Jacobi, Imelda Staunton, Samantha Bond and Burt Reynolds. My Week with Marilyn, featuring Michelle Williams, Dame Judi Dench and Kenneth Branagh was released in 2011.

**PAUL ELLIOTT** (Executive Producer, Los Angeles, For Triumph Entertainment – Paul Elliott and Duncan C. Weldon). Producing together for 10 years from 1967 and again from 2001 as Triumph Entertainment Ltd., Paul Elliott and Duncan C. Weldon have produced or co-produced 300 London productions. Paul Elliott: Buddy - The Buddy Holly Story, Jolson (Olivier Award for Best Musical in 1997), Kat And The Kings (Olivier Award for Best Musical in 1999), The Goodbye Girl, Run For Your Wife, Stones In His Pockets (Olivier and Evening Standard Award in 2001) and The Shawshank Redemption. Paul has also produced more than 450 pantomimes. His first play, a comedy – There's No Place Like a Home, has been produced for two UK tours. *Backbeat* was Paul's 50th production in Toronto. #### GLASGOW CITIZENS THEATRE

"As theatrical icons go, few come bigger than Glasgow's Citizens Theatre," The Herald (Scotland). The Citizens Company was founded in 1943 by Scottish playwright James Bridie and the Citizens Theatre was permanently established in 1945. Since then, it has been one of Scotland's flagship producing theatres. Fondly known as The Citz, it is led by Artistic Director Dominic Hill — "A talent which is genuinely world-class." — Daily Telegraph. With a beautiful Victorian auditorium that dates from 1878, the Citizens has a rich history, presenting a world-class repertoire based on British and foreign classics, contemporary plays and new writing. Alongside its main stage and studio theatre program, it regularly tours to the Edinburgh Festivals, operates two nonprofessional acting companies — the Young Co. and Community Company — and produces a pioneering range of creative learning projects. The theatre has extensive backstage workshop facilities where all of its own sets and costumes are made. Backbeat received its world premiere at the Citizens Theatre in February 2010 and was universally loved by Glasgow audiences, who were on their feet at the end of every show.

MICHAEL RITCHIE (Artistic Director) is in his eighth season as Center Theatre Group's Artistic Director, and has led over 100 productions to the Ahmanson, Taper

and Douglas stages since his arrival in 2005. From 1996 to 2004 Michael was

the Producer of the Williamstown Theatre Festival and prior to that he was a Production Stage Manager in NYC. In addition, Michael inaugurated CTG's New Play Production Program, designed to foster the development and production of new work.



EDWARD L. RADA (Managing Director) returned to Center Theatre Group last year after previously serving as CTG's Chief Financial Officer for 12 years (1996 – 2008). Rada

spent the past three years as President of the Music Center Foundation, a nonprofit corporation that holds and invests the endowment and reserve funds for the Music Center and its resident companies (including CTG). Prior to his years at CTG, he was the Director of Finance at The Old Globe in San Diego and principal of Rada & Associates, an accounting firm that specialized in entertainment-related non-profit organizations and theatrical productions. He is a graduate of Occidental College in Los Angeles with numerous post-graduate coursework and credentials. He currently serves on the board of trustees for the pension, health and welfare and 401(k) plans of I.A.T.S.E. Local 33 Stagehands Union, on the board of directors of Theatre@Boston Court, and on the board of United Support of Artists for Africa/USA for Africa, among other affiliations.
