There were 28 members and guests in attendance this evening.


Eddie, KD8FTS, won the 50/50 raffle this evening.

Like many of you I have an interest in the weather. In fact, it was monitoring the Skywarn net that pushed me to finally get my license. I like t listening to the weather spotters to get pinpoint severe weather details. I took the training so I could participate.

I have had a weather alert radio in my home literally forever. I leave the radio(s) on 24/7 because you never know when weather will roll in. The first radios did not have any discrimination. Whenever NOAA issued an alert for anywhere the radio would sound off. I was so grateful when S.A.M.E. technology came in. With Specific Area Messaging Encoding we can program our alerts for the counties we are interested in. Actually, we can even program the types of alerts we want to be notified about.

My radios are programmed for all the surrounding counties so I can see how the weather is moving. I think having the ability to be alerted to severe weather is extremely important for safety. I have supplied weather radios to friends and family for my own peace of mind.

I hope all of you reading this have a properly-programmed weather alert radio located in an area where it can be heard anywhere in the house, especially when you are sleeping and leave your radio on 24/7 with good batteries for backup.

Whoops! Toby, WT8O

Some say, people learn from their mistakes. There is probably some truth to that nugget of wisdom; but if it rang true in my case, I would be a genius. Even hating to make mistakes, I've made my share several times over. But if I did learn anything from two recent radio operating blunders, I'll be one happy ham. Maybe I can pass my experiences along to others.

I always check my squelch adjustment before checking into nets. A few weeks back I was preoccupied writing the *W.O.* when the CARS Wednesday net started and did not check said adjustment. Looking back later, I remembered previously deviating from my normal squelch setting to pick up a repeater that had a poor signal. I heard nothing when the CARS net started. I waited, still nothing. I thought the NCS may have forgotten about the net that night. Still hearing nothing, I started the net myself. After sounding like an idiot and confusing everyone, I heard a station telling me the net was in progress and going just fine without my "help." Red faced, I found the problem, adjusted my squelch and checked in apologetically. The NCS was kind enough to cut me slack and consoled me saying something like "We all make mistakes." I was totally embarrassed and considered that the dumbest thing I had ever done on the air.

A few weeks later I almost topped that one with another stooge move. I was NCS that night, and after my beginning spiel could hardly hear stations checking in. I could hear something, but the signals were very weak and impossible to copy. Earlier in the day, I was experimenting with an HF antenna, and fiddled with every control on my radio. I tried readjusting everything with no improvement. I switched to another radio that took me several long minutes to hook up and finally got the net back on track. The problem was found the next day: a loose coax connection at my radio.

I hope I learned something for these mistakes.
