Furthermore, students must showcase their attainment of the seven learning outcomes for CAS:

- Determine strengths and growth areas
- Show that challenges have been taken, learning new skills.
- Show how to start and plan CAS.
- CAS experiences require dedication and persistence.
- Show collaboration abilities and recognize its benefits.
- Engage with global concerns

- Understand and assess ethical decisions and behaviors

In order to demonstrate their CAS experiences and learning outcomes, students must maintain a CAS portfolio. This portfolio consists of reflections, documentation, feedback, and self-evaluations. Additionally, students have regular meetings with their CAS coordinator or supervisor who offers guidance and support and approves the student's CAS activities.
