Munster, represented by Kerry and Limerick, met Ulster, represented by Cavan and Donegal, in football and hurling, respectively, in the All-Ireland Semi-Finals at Croke Park on Sunday last.

Soon a youthful brigade in their early twenties stalked upon the field. Round after round of vociferous cheering greeted their appearance. They were clad in Green and Gold, and came from Kerry. On entering the field the Kerry Team proceeded to the spot where Hogan, the Tipperary player, was shot on "Bloody Sunday". They knelt in prayer on the fatal sod while the spectators maintained a respectful silence. This action on Kerry's part was warmly appreciated by the crowd. As the Kerry team walked to the centre, the cheering was long and loud.
