Made by Nature

As winemakers, our ultimate goal is to create the purest expression of the grape, the terroir, and the vintage. We know following what Nature intended is the way to make the best-tasting wines. In 2016 and 2021, two separate studies* were conducted by Magali Delmas, a professor at the UCLA Institute

of the Environment and Sustainability, and Olivier Gergaud, a professor of Economics at the KEDGE Business School in Bordeaux, analyzing the scores of 200,000 wines from California and France.



They found that wines produced from organic and biodynamically produced grapes ranked higher than conventional wines by an average of 4.1 percentage points for California wines and 6.2 percentage points for French cuvées.

In 2016, we began our collaboration with Nature in the Clos Marey-Monge. The opportunity to create a biodynamic environment in an 18-hectare clos surrounded by a two-meter-high stone wall was too significant not to try.

What we have witnessed is incredible. Our soils are alive. One hundred-year-old vines that were bearing little fruit are now producing good yields. Our wines are more honest and energetic, displaying extra intensity on the nose and vibration on the palate.

Perhaps the increased presence of wildlife among the vines is another one of Nature's signs that she appreciates our efforts. Producing better-tasting wines and preserving the world all of us depend upon is a powerful idea that's more important now than ever.

Discover Burgundy

Located in the eastern part of France, south of Paris and north of Lyon, Burgundy is one of the world's most famous wine regions.

1,247 Climats extend from Dijon to Mâcon, and among them are some of the most famous names from the world of wine: Chambertin, Chambolle-Musigny, Clos de Vougeot, and our own Clos Marey-Monge. Each Climat has its own story – soil type, gradient, altitude, sun exposure, and winemaking techniques – which give its wines their distinct character. Two Climats situated just meters apart, within the same appellation and growing the same grape variety can produce two uniquely different wines.

Burgundy Vintages



Have you ever wondered why the vintage appears on the label of a wine? Alongside terroir, grape variety, and human intervention, weather conditions specific to each winegrowing region and vineyard combine to create unique cuvées, each with its qualities and aging potential. In four-season, continental climates like Burgundy, rain, cold heat, sun, frost, and hail can vary dramatically from year to year.



2016

A hot, dry summer preceded by a cold and wet spring with black frost in late April. Yields were the lowest of the past two decades. Harvest took place in mid-September. Elegant and soft whites. Complex, fresh reds with good acidity.



2017

Sunny spring and summer with perfectly ripe grapes harvested the first 2 weeks of September resulting in the best yields in a decade. Balanced, aromatic Chardonnays. Very expressive and harmonious Pinot Noirs.



2018

Beautiful spring weather preceded a sweltering, dry summer. Good yields, with grapes harvested early at the end of August and beginning of September. A promising vintage for whites and reds.



2019

Spring was punctuated by cold periods with several frosts and difficult flowering. Summer was hot and dry. Harvest in mid-September with low yields. Rich, well-balanced whites & delicious reds with a pleasant freshness.



2020

A vintage marked by an unusually rapid cycle with sunny, dry weather. Harvest at the end of August with heterogeneous yields. The white wines are fruity with a beautiful aromatic complexity. The reds are delicious with concentrated character.



2021

A severe frost in April, followed by a rainy summer. Harvest in mid-September with limited yields. A delicate, refined vintage. The whites are complex and aromatic. The reds are fruity and elegant.



2022

Generous and qualitative vintage, despite frost episodes in April and a very hot summer. Harvest at the end of August. Very good yields. Chardonnays are aromatic, with texture and a fresh finish. Pinot Noirs display crunchy red fruits and a good tannic structure.



2023

A dry spring, followed by an intense summer, alternating between storm episodes and heatwaves. Harvest at the beginning of September under high temperatures. Very good yields. White wines are rich and balanced. Pinot Noirs are expressive with an integrated tannic structure.

Our Clos Marey-Monge

When visiting from Paris, the next stop south of Beaune is Pommard, located close to the center of the Côte d'Or. With its mosaic of celebrated sun-soaked southeast-facing vineyards and captivating sights, smells, and sounds all year round, the village of Pommard is surrounded by ageless, timeless beauty. At its heart is our home, Château de Pommard.

Protected by a two-meter-high stone wall built at the beginning of the 19th century, Burgundy's largest monopole surrounds us. Our Clos Marey-Monge is a collection of distinct soil types with different compositions of limestone, iron-rich clay, alluvium, and other minerals essential to Pinot Noir.





Our Commitment to Better Wines

Since 1726, the winemaking families of our Château have left their indelible footprints in the soil. From the Micaults, the first family of Pommard, to the Marey-Monges, the most influential dynasty in all of Burgundy. Our family, Carabello-Baum, has the honor of guiding the estate into the future.

The biodynamic and organic certifications are symbols of our family's commitment to protecting biodiversity and environmental regeneration to ensure the vineyard flourishes for another 300 years.

The 2021 Clos Marey-Monge wines were the first vintage at Château de Pommard to receive Demeter biodynamic certification. But we are not stopping here. Our team continues to learn and improve as you will witness with our latest vintage release, the 2022.



2022

A Legendary Vintage

2022 marked the debut of Jean-Rémi Fray as our vineyard manager alongside his new team. It was also the inaugural year for Paul Negrerie and Sébastien Perdriau at the helm of our winemaking.

We embraced innovation, experimenting with new techniques in our vineyards and cellars. The harvest blessed us with an abundance of high-quality grapes, and we introduced new characteristics to the wines.

GRAPES GROWING

Each vintage commences with the pruning of the previous year's growth. In 2022, we adopted a later pruning schedule to mitigate the risk of late spring frost damage. This decision proved wise as we encountered frost in mid-April yet suffered minimal harm. The spring and summer brought dry and sunny conditions, with scarcely any rain, challenging us to find the perfect timing for the harvest. By late August, we began the meticulous process of hand-picking grapes across all 18 hectares of Clos Marey-Monge, which spanned 12 days.

WINE MAKING

Paul and Sébastien initiated their craft in the cellar even before the harvest, employing the "pied de cuve" technique to cultivate natural yeast from an early August pre-harvest. This year, we ventured into whole-cluster fermentation and experimented with amphora aging for portions of our cuvées. The presence of increased bacterial activity on the grapes prompted early malolactic fermentation, which we handled through a series of early devattings. We're immensely proud of the vintage's quality and the insights gained from our experiments with whole clusters and amphora.



TASTING NOTES

The 2022 vintage is distinguished by its richness, concentration, and ripe character. It was a warm, dry year, yielding wines with stable vegetal notes and vibrant color. Our Clos Marey-Monge 2022 Pinot Noirs burst with crunchy red fruits, showcasing a robust tannic structure and long, velvety finishes. Our Famille Carabello-Baum Pinot Noirs and Chardonnays all display the characteristics and aromatics of their prestigious appellations.

Wine critics have lavished praise on the 2022 Burgundy vintage, with many hailing it as exceptional. Jasper Morris MW remarked on the overall excellence of Burgundy wines, specifically noting Pommard's impressive performance in recent years.

Our Clos Marey-Monge 2022 Cuvées



Émilie
2022

In 2017, new vines were planted at the furthest eastern point of the Clos on clay-limestone soils with a sandy texture. Gravel and pebbles are also found in this area of the vineyard. This is where our Émilie cuvée begins her journey.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Intense ruby.

Nose: Bright red fruit aromas and floral notes.

Palate: Rounded tannins. Fruity and spicy notes.



Vivant Micault
2022

The vines producing our cuvée Vivant Micault were originally planted as an English garden. They grow on fine alluvial formations from the Avant-Dheune River and create a fruity Pinot Noir that is particularly enjoyable when young.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Ruby.

Nose: Aromas of cherry with a hint of floral notes.

Palate: A juicy retention of fresh fruits.





Grands Esprits 2022

Planted between 1970 and 1980, the vines giving birth to our Grands Esprits cuvée grow on rocky, limestone-rich soils. They produce a beautifully linear Pinot Noir with firm tannins and excellent potential for long aging.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Intense ruby.
Nose: Aromas of red fruit and spices.
Palate: Structured and dense tannins.



Nicolas-Joseph 2022

Some of the vines producing our Nicolas-Joseph cuvée are 80 years old. They grow on soils made of flat limestone rocks with red clay, yielding a fleshy and complex Pinot Noir with aromas and flavors of red fruits and silky tannins.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Deep ruby.
Nose: Blackfruit aromas and a touch of spice, with notes of vanilla & cocoa.
Palate: Melted tannins. Long and sapid pleasant finish.



75 Rangs 2022

The vines producing our 75 Rangs cuvée are planted on soils rich in magnesium, sodium, and potassium. At nearly 60 years old, they produce a Pinot Noir with prominent mineral notes and a trademark saline finish.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Intense ruby.
Nose: Aromas of ripe red fruits, with notes of prune and licorice.
Palate: Chiseled tannins. Salty and mineral finish.



Chantrerie 2022

The vines of Chantrerie are some of the oldest in the Clos. They grow on soils with one of the largest internal surface areas of clay in the Côte d'Or, producing a dark, rich and deep Pinot Noir with silky tannins and a mineral finish.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Intense ruby.
Nose: An aromatic bouquet with notes of blackcurrant and nutmeg.
Palate: Crisp and invigorating onset. Structured but generous tannins.



Clos Marey-Monge Monopole 2022

The largest monopole in Burgundy, Clos Marey-Monge benefits from a unique environment protected by a two-meter-high stone wall. Positioned at the base of the hill of Pommard, the complexity of our vineyard's soils comes from the alluvia, sand and gravel carried by the Avant-Dheune river a thousand years ago. Our blend of the seven cuvées from the limestone and clay-rich soils of the Clos creates a deep, elegant, and sophisticated Pinot Noir.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Intense ruby.
Nose: Delicate red fruits and floral notes.
Palate: Structured and ample tannins. Fresh and salty finish.

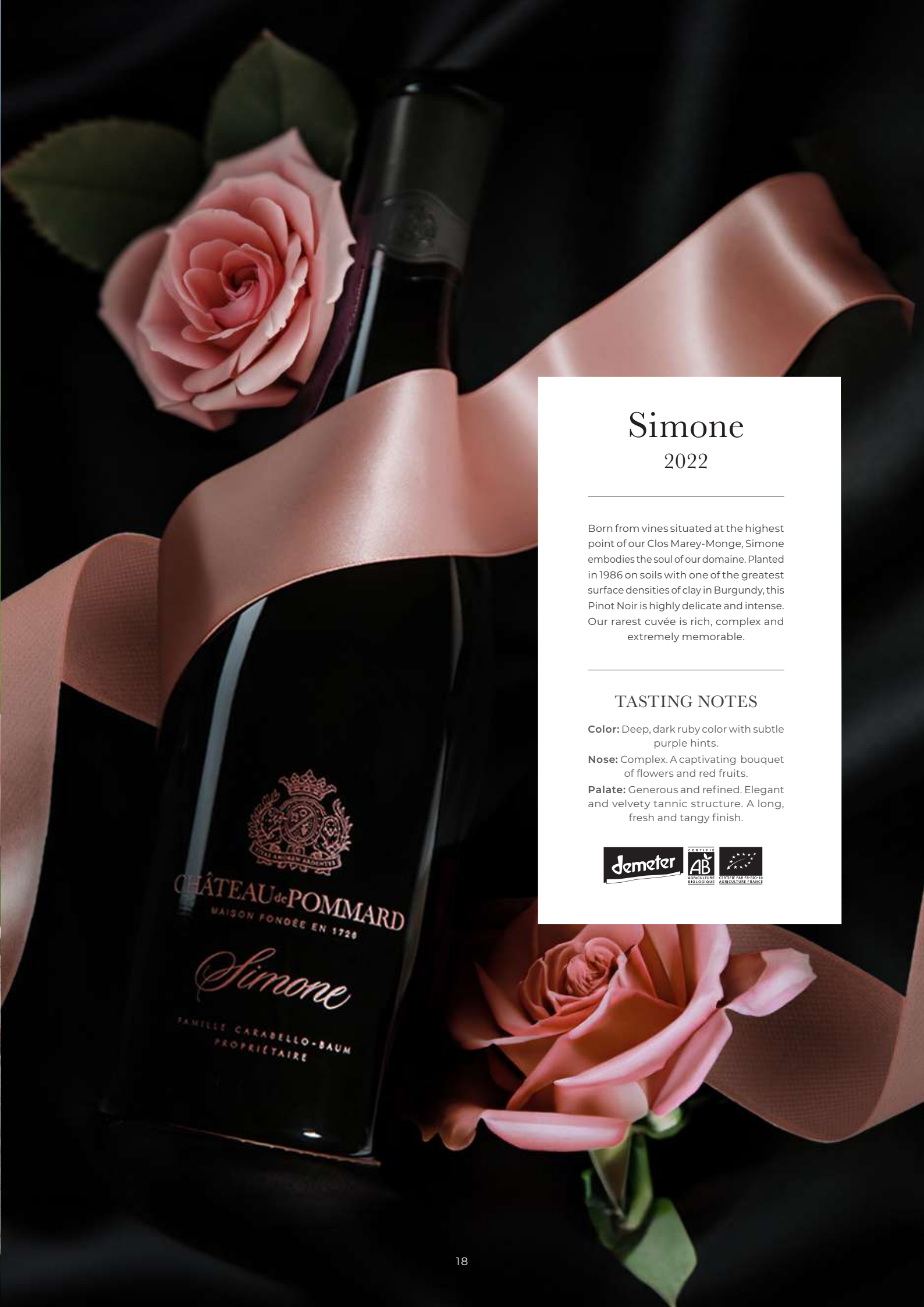


Simone 2022

Born from vines situated at the highest point of our Clos Marey-Monge, Simone embodies the soul of our domaine. Planted in 1986 on soils with one of the greatest surface densities of clay in Burgundy, this Pinot Noir is highly delicate and intense. Our rarest cuvée is rich, complex and extremely memorable.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Deep, dark ruby color with subtle purple hints.
Nose: Complex. A captivating bouquet of flowers and red fruits.
Palate: Generous and refined. Elegant and velvety tannic structure. A long, fresh and tangy finish.

REGIONAL APPELLATIONS

Bourgogne Pinot Noir 2022

Located on the plain that faces the Clos Marey-Monge, the soils of Pommard provide the ideal growing environment for the region's native red grape. The clay-rich soils of the Côte de Beaune are the cradle of our Bourgogne Pinot Noir, a balanced and silky wine that expresses the essence of Burgundy's iconic grape variety.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Ruby.
Nose: Aromas of red fruits and woody notes.
Palate: Long finish with a well-balanced tannic structure.



Bourgogne Chardonnay 2022

The limestone-rich soils of the Côte de Beaune are perfect for producing our well-balanced, fruity, and fresh Bourgogne Chardonnay. The most approachable Burgundy appellation embodies the essence of the region's native white grape. We see it as a welcoming introduction to all the Villages, Premiers Crus, and Grands Crus the region's vineyards have to offer.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Pale yellow.
Nose: Perfumed white fruit aromas with floral notes.
Palate: Round and persistent finish, with delicate notes of citrus.



Bourgogne Aligoté 2022

Although it is still widely misconceived to be less noble than other local grape varieties, Aligoté has prospered throughout Burgundy since the 17th century thanks to the diversity of the region's terroirs. This white grape grows mainly on limestone-rich marl and clay soils. The rich and round texture with a mineral edge shows the character of this typically Burgundian variety.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Gold.
Nose: Rich and complex with rhubarb and white flowers.
Palate: Notes of honey, with a lovely aromatic tension.



Nuits-Saints- Georges 2022

The Nuits-Saint-Georges appellation consists of two parts. In the north, its soils are rich in alluvial deposits from the Meuzin Valley. In the south, the silty soils come from the Vallerots Valley. The top of the hill has exposed limestone rocks. Born from vines on a clay-rich plot, our Nuits-Saint-Georges is at once intense and complex.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Ruby.
Nose: Fresh, with intense aromas of red fruit and licorice.
Palate: Generous, with velvety tannins and a sapid finish.

CÔTE DE NUITS

Vougeot Premier Cru “Les Petits Vougeots” 2022

Surrounded by two prestigious Grands Crus, “Les Petits Vougeots” is a tiny and highly sought-after vineyard in the Côte de Nuits and an excellent representation of the outstanding quality of the Vougeot appellation. Its marl and limestone-rich soils lend delicacy and depth to the wine.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Ruby.
Nose: Blackberry and black cherry, with lightly toasty and peppery notes.
Palate: Harmonious and elegant, with perfectly integrated tannins.

Clos de Vougeot Grand Cru 2022

Clos de Vougeot has been famous since its construction by monks in the 11th century. Some say that you can taste a part of Burgundy's history in a glass of this wine, which is rich, intense, and complex, thanks to an exceptional terroir composed of limestone and marl.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Ruby.
Nose: Smoky and peppery notes with red fruit aromas.
Palate: Generous with a rich finish.

CÔTE DE BEAUNE

Savigny-Les-Beaune 2022

Nestled between the Hill of Corton and the town of Beaune, Savigny-Les-Beaune is a centuries-old wine village. Historically, vineyard ownership passed between the Dukes of Burgundy and neighboring abbeys. Its limestone-rich soils produce fresh and floral Chardonnay, a gorgeous representation of this unique terroir.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Pale yellow.
Nose: Floral and fruity notes and a touch of toast.
Palate: Straightforward with ripe pear and apricot. A lovely tension on the finish.



Savigny-Les-Beaune 2022

Between the Hills of Corton and Beaune, Savigny-Les-Beaune is a centuries-old wine village. Historically, vineyard ownership passed between the Dukes of Burgundy and neighboring abbeys. Its gravel-like, limestone-rich soils produce a fresh, mineral, and elegant Pinot Noir.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Intense ruby.
Nose: Raspberry and floral notes, with a slight spicy touch.
Palate: Neat and refreshing with perfectly integrated tannins.



Savigny-Les-Beaune Premier Cru “Les Lavières” 2022

Situated in the picturesque valley of Savigny-Les-Beaune, “Les Lavières” is a south-facing Premier Cru plot. The vineyard’s name comes from “les laves” which are thin, flat stones that can be found in limestone-rich soils, offering ideal conditions for Pinot Noir to grow. The resulting wines are fleshy and powerful.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Deep ruby.
Nose: Red fruits and a light touch of licorice.
Palate: Rich and complex, with soft but present tannins.



MÂCONNAIS

Mâcon-Igé 2022

Bordered by the Mâcon-Azé appellation to the north and the Mâcon-Verzé appellation to the south, Mâcon-Igé is a well-defined terroir that widens out into a vast basin. Its rich marl and limestone soils enable us to produce a very fresh, expressive Chardonnay.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Pale yellow.
Nose: Citrus notes with perfumed, floral aromas of acacia.
Palate: Dominant freshness. Round finish, with notes of candied apricots.



Pouilly-Fuissé Premier Cru “La Maréchaude” 2022

The Pouilly-Fuissé appellation embraces 4 villages: Solutré-Pouilly, Fuissé, Vergisson and Chaintré. Its clay-limestone soils and southerly exposition are perfect for the producing a powerful and voluptuous Chardonnay.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Gold.
Nose: Floral and buttery aromas, with a touch of acacia and linden.
Palate: Persistent roundness and perfect balance. An intense finish with notes of citrus.

Saint-Romain 2022

Instituted in 1947, the Saint-Romain appellation is located at the very heart of the Côte de Beaune and spreads across a steep slope with excellent marly and limestone-rich soils. The Chardonnay vines grow on clay banks, giving birth to fruity white wines with intense minerality.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Pale yellow.
Nose: White fruit aromas with floral notes.
Palate: Aging aromas and distinctive minerality. A refreshing finish with delicate citrus notes.



Ladoix Premier Cru “Les Gréchons” 2022

Ladoix is the last vineyard in the northern Côte de Beaune before entering the Côte de Nuits. “Les Gréchons” is one of the highest plots on the steep slopes of the iconic Hill of Corton, once home to ancient quarries. Sedimentary, fossil-rich soils produce an intense and mineral Chardonnay that can be enjoyed today or aged for years.



TASTING NOTES

Color: Gold.
Nose: Notes of vanilla and pear.
Palate: Powerful, with white fruit and toasty notes. An intense mineral finish.



Bourgogne Rosé 2023

With a limpid and shiny peach color, our Burgundy Rosé 2023 expresses captivating fresh aromas of melon, citrus, and English candy. The palate is well-balanced, revealing a refreshing finish with citrus notes.

TASTING NOTES

Color: Peach.

Nose: Fresh aromas of melon, citrus, and English candy.

Palate: Well-balanced. A refreshing finish with citrus notes.
