Concept

God keeps His promises.

Goal

Children will learn that Jesus came to earth just as God said He would. Because He always keeps His promises, they can always trust what He says.

Passage

Luke 2:1-20 Key Verse: "You will find a baby wrapped in cloths, and lying in a manger." Luke 2:12 (NASB)

Background Information/Teacher Helps

"It is the fulfillment of specific detailed prophesies that provides the Bible with its divine seal—a seal that can never be counterfeited, since it is affixed to the truth which it attests, namely, that God's foreknowledge of the actions of free and intelligent agents is one of the most 'incomprehensible attributes of Deity and is exclusively a Divine perfection.' We readily concede that the prophets themselves may not have understood the full import of the predictions they gave when they pictured beforehand the expected Messiah, yet the language they used could not refer to anyone else in history. It was thus that Paul was able to persuade the Jews that Jesus was the predicted One 'out of the prophets' (Acts 28:23).

"The drama of fulfilled prophecy is most evident in connection with the birth of Jesus, the details of which were exactly accomplished when He was born of Mary. Men must be blind if they cannot see that the identification between the One predicted and the One presented is most positive and complete. 'Then said the Lord unto me, . . . I watch over my word to perform it.' (Jer 1:12, R.V.). Thus having spoken, and guarding all, He inspired the prophets to set forth the truth carefully and accurately, for nothing short of absolute accuracy will suffice in the fulfillment of all He spoke concerning the Son He promised to send into the world."1

The Bible certainly does have a "divine seal—a seal that can never be counterfeited." That the prophecies were totally and accurately fulfilled is compelling evidence that God's word is the one and only truth.

Prayer	Pray for the children, w/your team before class, during the week. Pray simple short prayers with the children.
Lesson Lg. Group	 "Baby Jesus" Main Points: God's promises are in the Bible (show the children your Bible) God's angel told Mary she would have a baby and would name him Jesus. Jesus was born in a barn where animals lived. God keeps His promises! God promised Jesus would come and He did. Jesus came to earth because He loves us.
Activities Lg. Group	 Manipulative – Nativity Scene Instructions: Set up the nativity and allow the children to play with it. Ask the children if they know who the people are. Why are they in a stable with animals? Role Play Instructions: Use the puppets and bendable nativity figures to reenact Jesus' birth.
Craft #1	Color page – Mary, Joseph and Baby Jesus Instructions: Give each child a coloring page and some stickers. Color the picture and put some stars in the sky. Talk with the children about God's promise to send Jesus.
Craft #2	Color page – Baby Jesus Instructions: Color the picture of baby Jesus and talk with the children about God's promise to send Jesus.
Craft #3	Color card – God Keeps His Promises Instructions: Give each child a folded card. Color the picture of Angel Gabriel and the block letters if they want. Talk with the children about God's promise to send Jesus.
Craft #4	Color page – You will find a baby Instructions: Color the picture and give each child a sticker of baby Jesus to put in the manger. Talk with the children about God's promise to send Jesus.
