This access guide is designed to provide clear information about the facilities and services available at the theatre for Deaf and hard of hearing visitors, blind and partially sighted guests, wheelchair users, and all patrons with access needs. Whether this is your first time visiting or you are a returning guest, we hope this guide helps you plan and enjoy your experience with confidence.

A Brief History of the Savoy Theatre

The Savoy Theatre holds a unique place in London's cultural history. First opened in 1881 by theatre impresario Richard D'Oyly Carte, it was the first public building in the world to be lit entirely by electricity. The theatre was built to showcase the comic operas of Gilbert and Sullivan, produced by Carte himself.

Over the years, the Savoy has played host to a wide range of productions—from operettas and musicals to contemporary plays and concerts. After a major refurbishment following a fire in 1990, the theatre reopened in 1993 with updated facilities while retaining its elegant Art Deco style.

Today, the Savoy Theatre continues to blend its rich heritage with modern innovation, offering world-class performances in an inclusive and welcoming space.

BOOKING INFORMATION

We are committed to ensuring that all our patrons have an enjoyable and accessible experience at the Savoy Theatre. To assist you in planning your visit, please find below the key information regarding our access booking process.

ATG Entertainment Access Membership Scheme

Our Access Membership Scheme is designed to make it easier for customers with disabilities to book accessible seats and services. It is free to join and enables access patrons to:

- Book accessible seats online
- Register proof of eligibility for Access prices
- Book Personal Assistant or Essential Companion tickets
- Receive priority information on upcoming Access Performances

How to Book Accessible Tickets Online

Once registered as an Access Member, you can book accessible tickets online through our website:

1. **Log In:** Use the 'Login/Register' button at the top right of the screen to access your account.
2. **Select Performance:** Choose the show and date you wish to attend.
3. **Choose Seating:**
 - **No Specific Requirements:** Select any standard seat. Access pricing will be available under the full price option.
 - **Specific Requirements:** Look for seats marked with the appropriate icon for your needs (e.g., wheelchair positions, visual or hearing impairments). Access pricing applies only to these designated seats.
4. **Personal Assistant or Essential Companion Tickets:** If eligible, you can book a companion ticket at no additional cost.

Booking in Person

You can also book access tickets in person at the Savoy Theatre Box Office, open:

- 10am to 5pm, depending on the show schedule
- Opening hours may extend on performance days

Our staff are trained to assist with access bookings and will be happy to help with selecting the most suitable seating and services for your visit.

Personal Assistant or Essential Companion Tickets

Eligible Access Members can book a Personal Assistant or Essential Companion ticket at no additional cost. To qualify, you must provide proof of eligibility, such as:

- An Access Card from Nimbus Disability
- A letter from a medical professional
- A local authority-issued letter confirming eligibility

Ticket Delivery

Once your booking is confirmed, you will receive an eTicket via email. Please ensure you check your inbox and spam/junk folders. If you haven't received your eTicket within 48 hours of booking, please contact us, and we will assist you promptly.














- **Audio Described Performances:** For patrons who are blind or partially sighted.
- **Captioned Performances:** For patrons who are Deaf or hard of hearing.
- **BSL Interpreted Performances:** Featuring British Sign Language interpreters.
- Relaxed Performances: Designed to accommodate patrons with sensory sensitivities or learning disabilities.

Visual Assistance

For guests seeking easy access with no or fewer stairs, the Dress Circle is the best option. If you would like to view the captions during the performance, we recommend selecting seats within the Dress Circle as highlighted on our seating app.

For visitors with visual impairments, the front of the stalls provides the most suitable viewing experience.

If you require further assistance or more detailed information, please don't hesitate to contact our Box Office team, who will be happy to help.

Services for D/deaf and hard of hearing

Our venue offers the Mobile Connect app for sound enhancement, please follow the instructions on the link for details on how to download the app to your own device prior to arrival. We recommend using wired headphones for the best connection, and using a power bank to recharge your device during the performance <https://atgtix.co/MobileConnect>

Anyone using this system will be able to hear a live feed of the performance on stage (with Audio Description if attending an Audio Described performance) through their headset or, if they wear digital hearing aids, through from wherever they are sat throughout the auditorium when they are connected to the app.

If you have either an iPhone/iPod/iPad or an android smartphone you can download the FREE Sennheiser Mobile Connect App from the app store.

WHEELCHAIR USERS AND LIMITED MOBILITY

There are 75 steps to the Stalls from the foyer. These are NOT advised for patrons with limited mobility. There is no lift in the theatre. Dress Circle is 32 steps down from the foyer (two flights of stairs). There is also street - level access into the Dress Circle which can be accessed from Carting Lane. Patrons wishing to use this entrance need to arrive at the theatre no earlier than half an hour before show-time and one of their parties should inform Stage Door (also located on Carting Lane) that they need to use this entrance.

Patrons who arrive via the main foyer on Savoy Court can be escorted around to the Carting Lane entrance by a member of staff. Patrons that wish to do this should be aware that it is a 10-minute walk around the theatre and escorting staff will not be able to aid in the maneuvering of wheelchairs. This route also involves navigating gradients on Savoy Street.

Wheelchair access is to the Dress Circle from Carting Lane. The theatre can accommodate 1 wheelchair patron with a companion or 2 wheelchair patrons with no companions seated together at each performance. There is also availability for patrons who can transfer into seats. Patrons who wish to transfer from wheelchairs should be aware that there are steps to the most accessible seats at the ends of row F (2 steps) and G (3 steps) of the Dress Circle are recommended. If patrons wish to transfer but are unable to negotiate any steps, the wheelchair space is the only seating with complete level access.

**There are four bars in the theatre – Stalls, Dress, Mezzanine and Grand Circle.
There is no level access to the bars, but drinks can be brought to seats.**

Accessible Toilets

There are toilets on all levels of the theatre. Accessible toilet facilities are located on the Dress Circle level.



ASSISTANCE DOGS

Assistance dogs are welcome at the Savoy Theatre. They can stay with you during the performance; however, you must inform the Box Office so that an aisle seat can be booked. Alternatively, a member of staff will care for your dog during the performance.
