What do we mean by explanatory frameworks?

- Explanatory frameworks are created to help understand complex events and situations
- They are neither true not false but judged by their usefulness for a particular purpose. They are a representation.

What do we mean by explanatory accounts or programme theories?

- Explanatory frameworks may provide an abstract picture of relevant domains but don't provide the explanations of how change happens
- Programme theories or explanatory accounts outline the specific idea about how a programme causes the intended or observed outcomes.
- In complex systems programme theories may be developed across and between multiple layers (e.g. individual, interpersonal, organisational)
- Combined these may be called theories of transformation.

Framework


Sufficiently 'inclusive'
