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■ EHA Partners with Columbus Diaper Bank to Support Families in Need

Columbus, OH: Ebenezer Healthcare Access (EHA) has partnered with the Columbus Diaper Bank to expand support for vulnerable families and address a critical need: access to diapers. The partnership became operational this spring, with EHA receiving its first diaper delivery on May 7, 2026. The collaboration aims to help families with infants and young children across Central Ohio. The Columbus Diaper Bank works to provide diapers to families in need while promoting dignity, health, and opportunity for every child. Its mission aligns closely with EHA's commitment to supporting individuals and families facing barriers to healthcare and basic necessities. For many low-income households, diapers are a significant expense that is not covered by programs such as SNAP. Limited access can affect a child's health and hygiene, a parent's ability to work, and access to childcare services. EHA serves many pregnant women, new mothers, and families with

young children who face financial challenges. Through this partnership, the organization is better equipped to meet those needs. "Access to diapers is a basic necessity, not a luxury," EHA representatives said. "By working together, we can provide practical support that improves the well-being of both children and their families."

Beyond supplying diapers, the initiative helps reduce financial stress, supports healthy child development, and improves access to childcare and early education programs that often require parents to provide diapers. The partnership also strengthens family stability by helping parents avoid difficult choices between purchasing diapers and paying for other essentials such as food, transportation, and housing. As the collaboration grows, EHA and the Columbus Diaper Bank remain committed to ensuring that every child in Central Ohio has access to the basic resources needed to thrive.

■ EHA Receives Dayton Proclamation for Community Impact
