

The 2023 Financial Times Master in Management ranking:

emlyon business school continues its progression and confirms its rank as #4 of the schools in France

On September 11th, 2023, the Financial Times published its ranking of the world's best Masters in Management: emlyon business school confirms its 4th rank among the French business schools, behind HEC, ESCP and ESSEC. On a global scale, the School goes up 2 ranks as compared to last year, and is now #7 worldwide.

A high-quality Master in Management program

The Master in Management (*Grande Ecole* Program) of **emlyon** business school is thereby recognized as a program of excellence, in France and on the international scene. While the School was #4 in France and #9 worldwide in the 2022 Financial Times ranking, it is now #7 worldwide, going up 2 ranks.

An outstanding career progression

The Financial Times demonstrates how the graduates of the Master in Management of **emlyon** business school experience an amazing career start:

- #2 of the business schools in France on the "career progress" criteria. The young graduates of **emlyon** business school are rapidly advancing in their careers.
- Three years after graduation, alumni's average salary is at € 101,747 (101.7 K): that is a +64% increase as compared to their salaries on coming out of the program.
