You are invited to apply to emlyon's 17th Ph.D. outdoor seminar in Chamonix. A fantastic opportunity to get constructive feedback on your doctoral/post-doctoral work, connect with great fellow PhDs/post-docs and profs (and have the opportunity to ski the mythical Vallée Blanche if you so wish).

Concept

Your idea takes central stage. At last a seminar where we discuss *your* ideas! And you get feedback, lots of sharp and constructive feedback. Each student's paper is discussed during one hour (not counting informal discussions over a drink by the fireplace). Plus you go back home with four written reviews, two by profs, two by fellow PhDs or post-docs.

The seminar is also a fantastic opportunity to network with passionate academics. The group is small enough to favor interactions, and the student/prof ratio is unheard of: 12 students, 8 profs (and look at the roster!).

Note that we fully expect everyone to stay for the entire duration of the seminar and to attend all sessions. Students have to provide written reviews on two papers.

Accommodation & Travel

emlyon business school is paying for hotel and half-board for two nights. This means that if you're coming only for the seminar, you will bear no expenses except traveling. Should you wish to stay longer and ski, you're on your own, but remember to book in advance.

We have reserved rooms in cosy Hotel Labrador in Chamonix (see <u>www.hotel-</u> <u>labrador.com/en</u>). Please note that students share rooms with one other student.

You will have to make travel arrangements to the seminar yourself. Chamonix is easily reached by train, air, and land; check their website: <u>www.chamonix.com</u>.

In case of Covid-19 restrictions — hopefully not—, the seminar would be held online. Deadlines (strictly enforced!)

January 26th: Email your application to Bernard Forgues: <u>forgues@em-lyon.com</u>. It should include a 2-page summary of your paper, your vitae, and a support letter from your academic mentor.

March 1st: Send the final version of your paper, which we will circulate immediately to your assigned reviewers.

March 24th: The seminar being *very* intensive, make sure you arrive fully prepared.
