

Our new campus in Lyon


Campus presentation

Coming to the Campus

Campus address: 144 avenue Jean Jaurès, 69007, Lyon



The new campus is perfectly connected to the rest of the city thanks to many nearby public transport.

It is located near the **Jean Jaurès** metro station on the **Line B**.

Jean Macé, up the avenue is a transport hub where metro line B, tram line T2 and bus lines C4, C7, C12, C14 connect.










Formalities to enter in France

⇒ **If you are a citizen of a member country of the EU, the EEA or from Switzerland**; you don't need a visa.



Visa application

Do you **need a visa** to study in France? You can check **here.**

You can also check on this <u>website</u> if you are entitled to the **pre-consular process "Etudes en France".**

You will find more information on this process in the « Before arriving in France » section on <u>makers-board</u>.

If you are not subject to the « Etudes en France » pre-consular procedure, you will have to apply directly with the **French consulate**. Check on <u>France-visas</u> website to find out how and where you can apply depending on your country of residence.

Please note that you will first have **to be accepted** to **emlyon** business school and have **completed your administrative integration** (see IAEL section) to apply for your visa. This application **must be filled at least 3 months before arrival in France.**

Visa validation once arrived in France

If you have a **long-stay visa type D**, you have to validate it on the <u>ANEF</u> platform. Log in and follow the instructions.

The validation is mandatory and must be done in the three months following your arrival in France.

Cost of living

Monthly Budget: about €1000-1200*

- Rent: €500-600 (Lyon)
- Charges (electricity, gas, internet, water...): about €130
- Transport: €25 under 27 years old, €74,10 above
- Food: €200
- Miscellaneous (Insurances, other costs...): €100
- Phone provider: €10 à €15
- Leisure: €100

*These are just estimates which can vary depending on your lifestyle.



Loans

You can request a loan with **emlyon business school**'s bank partners only if you **have a garant who pays tax in France**. Otherwise, we recommand you to get a loan **before arriving in France** or via the **Prodigy Finance** program, if eligible.

<u>Prodigy Finance</u> offers advantagious loans for graduated international students enrolled in the best universities. All students in Master of Science (MSc) in emlyon business school are eligible.

To take with you on your journey

Documents to take along:

- Passport (or ID card for european citizens)
- Your birth certificate in its original copy (in your native language). You will have to translate it in French using a <u>certified translator</u>.
- European Health Insurance Card (only for EU citizens) running for the academic year duration (from September 1st to August 31st)
- ID pictures (passport type)
- Health records (vaccination records, special case, etc.)
- Emergency contacts



Remember to scan your documents and upload them to the cloud, or e-mail them to yourself to access them at any time.

Remember to bring the following:

- Some cash for your arrival in France
- A power supply adaptor: in France, we use the type-E plug at 230V / 50Hz.
- Clothes that match the weather in Lyon: summers are warm, with temperatures averaging 35°C, and winters are cold, with temperature going down to −5°C. Expect clear skies most of the year.

Train



The **SNCF** is a company managing the railway network in France. Visit the <u>SNCF Connect</u> website to book a journey.

You can also purchase subscriptions to reduce the cost of your journeys. We recommend the <u>Carte Avantage Jeune</u> or <u>MAX JEUNE</u> for those traveling a lot.

Carpool and coaches



<u>BlaBlaCar</u> provides **carpools or coaches** between cities at an attractive price.

Flixbus offers coaches between major European cities at a competitive price.

Getting to Lyon city center from the airport



From Lyon Saint -Exupéry airport :

- Rhônexpress directly joins Part-Dieu train station in **30 minutes**. A one-way ticket will cost you €**10,50 for people between 12-25 years old** (€17,10 for those over 25)
- <u>TCL</u> connects to Part-Dieu train station in 1 hour for the price of a single ticket (€2). Prepare your journey on tcl.fr.

From Paris airports:

- **From Paris Charles de Gaulle**, take a high-speed train (TGV) from the airport train station that goes directly to Lyon in less than 2 hours. Visit <u>SNCF Connect</u> website.
- **From Paris Orly, go to** Paris inner-city and take a high-speed train at Gare de Lyon train station that goes to Lyon in 2 hours. Prepare your journey to the city center on IDF Mobilités.



To prepare for your journey, we recommend the <u>Citymapper</u> app. It gathers the means of transportation from all the major cities in Europe.

Transport in Lyon



Metro-Bus-Tram

The **Transports en Commun Lyonnais (TCL)** manages a large network of metro lines, tram lines and bus lines. For people under **25 years old and students between 26 and 27 years**, the monthly subcription costs **€25.** Above **27 years old**, the subscription costs **€74,10.**

Visit TCL website to discover the network and prepare your journeys.



Did you know? For your transport subscription, you can ask your employer to reimburse 50% of your fees during your internship or apprenticeship in France.

Bikes & e-scoots

- **VELO'V**: You will find many **self-service bikes** in Lyon. All the information on the service and its subscriptions can be found on the <u>vélo'v</u> website.
- DOTT and TIER: to rent an e-scoot or a bike, you can use <u>DOTT</u> or <u>TIER</u> apps!

Banking

There are many banks in France. Either with branches (physically) or a direct bank (online). To create a bank account in France, you usually need the following documents:

- An ID or passport
- · an enrollment certificate
- a proof of address

French banks cannot refuse to open you an account. If they refuse, you can refer to Banque de France. For more information on your right, refer to <u>service-public.fr</u>

emlyon business school has many bank partners. You can check **emlyon banking partners'** offers on <u>IAEL platform</u> in the **« droits de scolarité » section.**

Phone providers



Get equipped at a bargain

If you need **dishes and appliances** for your new home at a low price, we recommend you to check on **charity shops and apps**.



- <u>Emmaüs</u> is an association which collects and sells back clothes and everyday product at a low price.
- <u>Geev, Donnons.org</u>, and <u>toutdonner.org</u> are online platforms where individuals give objects for free.
- <u>Leboncoin</u>, is an online second-hand selling platform which can also help you find what you are looking for.
- <u>ESN Cosmolyon</u> is one among many student associations in Lyon. They organize second-hand object sales. You can also check <u>lyoncampus.com</u> website to discover every solidarity initiatives.

Health and Insurance

The French healthcare system

For **stays longer than 90 days** in France, **it is mandatory to register** for Sécurité sociale (French healthcare). This healthcare is free and covers part of your health spending.



To register for Sécurité social, please refer to the **Ameli** website.

Attention! Being completely registered takes several weeks. Subscribe to international insurance to cover the first 90 days of your stay. (see section at the bottom of this page)

Citizen of a member country of the EU, the EEA or from Switzerland? You can ask for a European Health Insurance Card in your country. This card will cover your health spending during your stay.



La carte vitale

Once registered with the Sécurité sociale, you will be assigned a **13-digit ID number**, and you will be able to order your carte vitale. This free card is **to be shown to the practitioner or specialist** at every visit to be reimbursed.

Finding and declaring a General Practitioner

A General practioner **knows your medical records** and **guides you** to the right specialist. You can **declare a G.P.** on your <u>Ameli</u> account.

The <u>Doctolib</u> platform helps you **book a visit** with your G.P. or specialist of choice. You can **filter your search** to find a professional who **speaks your language.**

You can also use the app **Qare** to find online visit.

Additional healthcare coverage

The additional healthcare coverage (or mutuelle in French) is private insurance that cover cost not reimbursed by the Sécurité sociale. We recommend that you compare different offers before choosing.

Heyme is our insurance partner to cover your additional cost. You can get a **10% discount** with the code **EMLYON-10**



Civil liability

It is a **mandatory insurance** that covers you in case of damage inflicted to a third party during your study or your private life.

This guarantee **may already be included** in one of your insurance contracts, such as housing insurance, banking contract, etc.

If none of your contract cover civil liability, **emlyon** business school **has a partnership** with Saint Christophe Insurance that can be subscribed during your IAEL integration.

International Insurance

For stays under 90 days or if you have a **medical condition** that requires regular visits, we recommend you **subscribe to international insurance** starting at the date of your arrival.

emlyon business school **provides international insurance** to its international students who arrive in France to study for more than 6 months.

Attention! If you are an international student who will study at emlyon business school for less than 6 months, you are not covered and have to subscribe to your own insurance.

Administrative Integration (IAEL)

You have to fill in your registration on the <u>IAEL platform</u>.



Completing this step is critical for accessing the campus and fulfilling other administrative processes in France. At the end, you will receive an enrollment certificate and your student card.

Do not forget to click on « valider votre dossier » at the bottom right of the screen!

Student card

Once your **IAEL registration is completed**, you will receive your student card by mail. This <u>ISIC</u> card is recognized in over 100 countries and gives you **access to many advantages and services.**



Attention! Always have your card with you. Otherwise, you won't be able to pass the gates at the campus entrances.



This card can be charged with money to pay at CROUS university restaurants and at the printers. All the information on how to recharge your card can be found on the Makersboard section « Ma carte étudiante »

Library

Located at ground level in Building B, you can access large collections of books and publications to borrow. You will also find individual and collective workspaces, as well as information specialists to guide you in your research.
