

Fourteen years ago, Talmage Morrison sold running shoes out of the trunk of his car to help finance Dallas' first marathon. His efforts as shoe salesman, promoter, aid station monitor and race director helped make the race something special for the 80 men and two women who took part.

Since then, Morrison, who is the founding father of distance running in the city of Dallas, has watched the race evolve into the largest marathon in Texas. A race that consistently ranks among the top 10 marathons in the country for appeal, hospitality and organization. A race that has grown from the 82 who showed up that first day back in 1971 to the 3,636 who entered the 1983 edition. A race that once was contained in a city park but now has expanded to cover the entire city.

And with today's hefty budget of \$105,000, it is a race that would take an awful lot of shoe sales to pay the tab.

For those runners out there not familiar with the history of the race, affectionately known as The Rock, there are a few things you should know about Dallas' most prestigious footrace.

First, the race was founded and championed by Morrison in the spring of 1971. It started out as the showcase event of the Cross Country Club of Dallas. The race derived its name from the city lake the course still encircles.

The race remained the domain of the CCCD until 1976. That was the year there were two White Rock Marathons. The first six editions of the race had been held in late February or early March. When the Aerobics Center of Dallas joined the CCCD in sponsoring the race in 1976, it was decided that the late-winter, early-

spring weather in Texas was too unpredictable and the race should be moved to early December. And so in 1976 there were two White Rock Marathons.

In December, 1976, 300 runners entered the race. The following year, three times that many entered, marking the largest increase in growth in the race's history.

The following year, a formal separate, non-profit corporation was formed with Lou Neeb as chairman, and sponsors were recruited. The CCCD remained the cornerstone of the event with responsibility for the race itself, and the organization made one of its goals to build the race into one of the top 10 marathons in the country. That goal has been accomplished.

One of the bylaws of the organization states that the committee is obligated to support amateur athletes from time to time by financially sponsoring runners. A fine example of that commitment was the 1983 marathon, when the committee voted funds to help send the men's and women's winners — Kyle Heffner and Sue Moen — to the U.S. Olympic Marathon Trials.

Since the committee has taken over the direction of the race, it has overseen several course changes, including a dramatic move from a route that was contained at the lake to one that involved the entire city.

The move to a downtown start and finish was difficult and controversial, but because of the increasing size of the field, it also was necessary. In 1983, the move was completed without a hitch. Also that year, the date was switched from the first Saturday in December to Sunday, so as to avoid major traffic problems.



much to the delight of the runners and the race officials.

Throughout the changes in the course and in the governing body, the main objective has been to put on a race for the runners. It is important to note that a runner lacks for nothing on this course, be it fluids, medical aid, split times, mile markers, course monitors, sag wagons, police protection, even entertainment. If he needs anything, it's there.

In addition to the concern for the runners' comfort, the race officials also make certain the course is certified by The Athletics Congress, so that all times are eligible for Boston qualification and any record status.

One of the most notable things about the Dallas White Rock Marathon is it is not a money race. No runner, regardless of name, previous time, shoe endorsement or number of magazine covers, receives any money above or below the table for competing in this race, and that includes names like Kyle Heffner, John Lodwick, Jeff Wells, Julie Brown and Glenys Quick, all of whom have run here. Some expenses are paid and a few entry fees are waived, but that's all.

Obviously, that philosophy prevents The Rock from attracting many top runners, particularly with the prize-money Houston-Tenneco Marathon only a month away, but the race officials don't mind.

"We don't intend to get into a bidding war with other races for runners," says Donald Key, president of the Dallas White Rock Marathon Board. "I'm not even sure we would consider ever offering prize money either. Most of the runners in our race don't care who is at the front of the pack anyway. We are unique in our approach to this event, and we see no reason to change. We're not seeking a big television contract or trying to turn ourselves into a major media event. Our main concern is to put on a good race for the runners. If some world-class runners want to enter our race, fine, we welcome them. We'll try to treat them as well as

For those runners who aren't in the cash dash, there are many reasons to recommend The Rock. Since the switch to December, the weather has been fairly cooperative, with temperatures ranging from 40 degrees at the start to 60 at the finish. The competition, while not necessarily headline material, is not shabby. One of the reasons some of the better marathoners, like Brown, do occasionally show up for The Rock is the course.

In the days when the course looped around the lake twice, it stood as one of the fastest tracks in the country. Flat as a corn tortilla. Top runners seeking a fast time to catch the eye of sponsors and race directors kept The Rock in mind. Brown, for instance, flew in from California and cruised a 2:33:39 to set the record for the old course. Lodwick set the men's mark of 2:12:18 in 1982, the last year for the old route.

When the course moved downtown in 1983, it drew some criticism for being too tough. One of The Rock's major attractions long had been the fast course, which made it ideal for those trying to qualify for Boston. Suddenly, the course was no longer an ally, it had become a foe. It is true, there were some mean hills on that first city-wide route and the cries of anguish could be heard loud and clear.

As a result, a new course was designed for the 15th running of The Rock, and while the elevation still rises and falls, the effect is more gradual.

"We have taken great pains to ensure a faster, more pleasing course," says first-time race director Steve Shopoff, a veteran of many marathons and a survivor of the Western States 100. "We have flattened as many hills as possible, although we couldn't eliminate all of them."

As a result, the present route has taken on the effect of a more rolling course with a flat section around the lake from miles 10 to 20. From 20 to 22 there are a couple of hills, but from mile 22, it's a gradual downhill to the finish at Dallas City Hall. ■



Ordinarily, the race is fairly easy to predict. Race officials, runners and the media generally have a pretty good idea of who to watch.

Not this year.

The 15th edition of the Dallas White Rock Marathon was as unpredictable as the Texas weather and as wide open as the Lone Star prairie. It was truly anybody's race. Show up fit and ready, and the 18-karat gold medallion for first place is yours.

That's what Bruce McKay of Winnipeg, Canada, and Karen Miller of Laredo, Texas, did. They might not have recorded the fastest times in White Rock history, but they were faster than any of the other 3,284 runners on this day. Fast enough to walk off with top honors.

Mckay flew in from Canada with his roommate Bob Cook. Both runners were attempting their first marathon. The 24-year-old McKay proved to be the stronger of the two on this day, building on a 12-second half-way point lead to finish first in 2:20:20. It turned out to be one of the slower winning times in the history of the race, but considering it was McKay's first marathon and he ran most of the race by himself, the performance wasn't too bad.

Cook had a tougher time of it, finishing third in 2:21:37. Don Bene, a graduate assistant at Oral Roberts University, overtook Cook at 19 miles to capture runner-up honors with a time of 2:20:57 in his first attempt at the marathon.

Fourth place also went to a first-time marathoner. Kraig R. Vanderbeek of the University of Nebraska claimed the honor by running 2:26:40.

Mckay led the race from six miles on and was never seriously challenged, although Bene did pull within 35 seconds of him late in the race.

Miller would have fit into that first-timer category had she not run 3:15 at the Las Colonias Marathon in San Antonio four weeks earlier.

Though she trailed for much of the race, Miller felt strong at all times. Fourth at half-way point, the former bodybuilder was one of four runners to run the second half at a faster pace.

Huber, who drove in from Wichita, Kan., for the race, ran out of gas and eventually was passed again by Andree Falls of Dallas. The 24-year-old Falls finished second in 3:00:59, while Huber took third in 3:03:29. Like Miller, Huber had run a marathon only weeks before, finishing third in the Macy's Marathon in Wichita in a time of 3:03:57. Falls had not run a marathon in two years. Her last effort was the Paris Marathon, which she finished in 3:13.

Wayne Jones, 42, of Dallas was the top male Masters runner, completing the course in 2:35:11 and taking 29th place overall. Forty-one-year-old Fay Dizerega of Oklahoma was the first women's Master in 3:12:18, good enough for 13th place among women.

Rick Gore was the top wheelchair finisher in a time of 2:32:20.

Blind athlete Harry Cordellos finished in 3:21:54, and Johnny Kelley set a new unofficial half-marathon record for age 77 of 1:53:22, finishing in front of the C. C. Young retirement home where he was enthusiastically greeted by many of the residents.

Among those entered in the marathon was Bob Poppe, otherwise known as "Mr. Marathon." It's easy to see how Poppe got the name. The Rock marked his 172nd marathon and his 55th since he turned 60 two years ago. It also was his 21st marathon this year. Incidentally, he also has run 13 ultramarathons, five of which were 62 miles and eight that were 50 miles. Those aren't included in his marathon count.

On the other end of the age spectrum, 12-year-old Michelle Sellers of Iowa Park, Texas, finished fifth in a personal best 3:04:27 to win the 15-and-under age group by nearly an hour and 45 minutes.

And, take for instance, the story of Carol Beck. She finished fourth in 3:04:05. That's slower than her best of 2:57:33, but it isn't bad considering that four months ago she gave birth to her 6-pound, 13-ounce daughter Heidi.

"Having a baby made me stronger," the 27-year-old Beck said. "It taught me what pain was all about." ■



Great pains were taken by race officials to ensure a course that was attractive and offered runners the best opportunity for fast times.

"The new course avoids the hills, promises faster times and highlights Dallas' most scenic areas — Turtle Creek, Highland Park, White Rock Lake, Lakewood Boulevard and historic Swiss Avenue," said race director Steve Shopoff.

In addition to the speakers, the day-long exposition featured clinics on basketball, tennis and football, as well as fitness testing, videotaped gait analysis, computerized health evaluations, diet analyses, demonstrations on the use of the latest fitness equipment and aerobic exercises.

It was a full day of activities that was well received by the runners and their families. And the best part of all was the whole thing was free.

The pre-race spaghetti dinner really

put the runners in a festive mood. While everyone loaded up on pasta, Dr. Kenneth Cooper addressed the gathering on the subject of their own mortality.

Since the death of noted running writer Jim Fixx, Dr. Cooper has been busy writing a book regarding the myths surrounding runners. Too many runners, he said, think themselves invincible. Invincible from injury, illness, disease, heart problems, and, to a certain degree, death.

Dr. Cooper is waging a campaign to dispel those myths of invulnerability and his speech to the runners went a long way toward convincing those who would challenge themselves the following day.

In addition to Dr. Cooper's address, Mr. Boston Marathon, Johnny Kelley, took the microphone. The man who

has run in 53 Boston Marathons captivated the audience with his anecdotes and his words of encouragement and inspiration. The 77-year-old Kelley, who won Boston in 1935 and again in 1945, showed old footage of the 1937 and 1938 Boston Marathons.

Although Kelley now runs only one marathon a year — Boston — he has agreed the past two years to run half of the Dallas race. Kelley centers his annual checkup at the Cooper Clinic around the Dallas White Rock Marathon.

On occasion, Kelley can be moved to song. This was one of those occasions as he thrilled the audience with his rendition of "When You're Young at Heart."

Steve Shopoff, the race director, also spoke at the pre-race dinner, giving the runners a photographic tour of the

surprises the following morning.

One of the most interesting sidelights of the weekend occurred during the race itself.

In an effort to encourage greater participation at the aid stations and give an additional boost to the runners, the marathon officials devised an aid-station competition.

Each of the 14 aid stations would be sponsored by either a corporation or an organization. Eleven corporations, including ARCO, May Petroleum, JCPenney, Texas Instruments, Clark Hatch Physical Fitness Center, Mostek, the Dallas Fire Department, Mobil Oil, Downtowner Fitness Center, VITA and Steak and Ale, sponsored aid stations. Three individual organizations, Runner's Round-up, Team Thistle and The Last Chance Saloon, volunteered to sponsor the remaining water stops.

TI, which was in charge of the 11-mile aid station on the west side of White Rock Lake, took on the theme of the popular television show M*A*S*H and recreated the 4077th complete with individuals dressed as characters from the show. All 4077 personnel dressed the part, sporting Army fatigues and caps and operating out of large, green canvas tents.

While most of the aid-station crews were basically upbeat, Team Thistle went the opposite direction. Located at 23.5 miles, this wacky group of ultramarathoners chose to disregard the "You look great" chorus sung by most of the other aid stations for a less cheery — and certainly more accurate — "You look awful" cry.

To complement the theme, the Thistles rigged up a skeleton in a casket and created an archway of black balloons leading to the aid station. Because the theme of this oasis was "Our business is waiting on you," all aid-station workers were dressed as waiters or waitresses.

Alas, the Thistles' enthusiastic efforts were not enough as TI and the crew of the 4077th took first place in the aid-station competition.

The City of Dallas provided a tre-

in the form of equipment and services, particularly traffic control. In a city built around the automobile, conducting a race along heavily traveled streets is no small task, and without the city's assistance, this race could not be conducted on such a grand scale.

Although mostly unnoticed, the policemen who helped keep the runners safe did a remarkable job. One officer, in particular, stood out as an example of the city's commitment to the race.

It was at mile 20, and the cars were beginning to stack up at the protected intersection. The officer directing traffic was doing his best to allow the cars to cross the course during large gaps between runners, but one woman, who had been waiting for what she felt was an unreasonable amount of time, began honking her horn so insistently that the noise became an irritant to everyone.

The officer strode up to the woman's car and told her to back off the horn. She did, but when she reached the front of the line, she darted across the intersection and nearly struck a couple of runners.

The officer was so infuriated that he sprinted after her. The woman stopped and when the policeman caught up with the car, he reached in the driver's window and removed the keys to the ignition. He then strode back to his own vehicle and radioed for a tow truck to haul the woman's car away.

His actions were met with enthusiastic cheers and applause from all the onlookers at the intersection.

As a result of all the care and attention paid to the needs of the runners, there were no mishaps of any kind along the course.

After the race, the runners were treated, as always, to a remarkable feast at the post-race awards banquet in the Dallas Convention Center sponsored by Steak and Ale.

The Dallas White Rock Marathon is the only major marathon in the country that bestows all its awards in every category the day of the race.

It is just another touch that makes this race stand out among the others. ■
