This toolkit is primarily for middle and high school teachers, counselors, and administrators looking to implement lesson plans and activities for Red Ribbon Week.







#### PRINCIPLES OF ADDICTION



## **6 Strategies for Discussing Tough Topics**

These strategies are designed to provide guidance into how to navigate conversations that can sometimes be challenging, empowering educators to feel even more confident in their ability to be a resource to students in need.



**BE AUT HENTIC** Reference a time that you made a mistake, or weave into conversation a tactic that you use to manage your own wellbeing.



**BE PREPARED** Know your resources: who students can contact at your school and in the **community for further support.** 



#### **ACTIVE LISTENING**

"There are some things that I can do to help, or just listen, or offer some advice. I could also connect you to a resource. What do you think would be most helpful right now?"



### HIGHLIGHT STUDENT STRENGTHS

When a student comes to you with a personal issue: acknowledge the strength and bravery that it likely took them to come forward.



#### PRACTICE WHAT YOU PREACH

The classroom is an important place to reinforce the messages that students are receiving. Demonstrate to students that the lessons that they learn online **extend into the "real** world."

### FOLLOW THROUGH AND FOLLOW UP

It seems obvious, but If you say you are going to do something, do it. On the other hand, make it a point to **check-in with the students** after a

conversation.
