



Video Type: Modeling

WATCH:

Modeling Video Lessons teach basic social communication skills through video modeling of the target behavior. Intended for **younger or beginning level students**, each lesson teaches a single skill using simple language. Students watch the target skill modeled **multiple times** in order to gain an understanding of how to demonstrate it. These lessons are only one-two minutes long, so we recommend viewing multiple times for extra review!

LEARN:

Before the video, you can introduce the skill it covers. For **early learners or non-readers** we suggest printing out our visual icons to help you preview the skills

During the video pause and rewatch scenes as needed. The main action will be modeled/repeated three times throughout the video in order to help individuals process and retain what they've seen.
