

## PREVIEW Ladies' SUPER G – Sunday 2 Dec 2018

### Weirather eyeing successive wins in Lake Louise

- Tina Weirather has won the super-G crystal globe in each of the last two seasons. The last skier to win the ladies' super-G classification three times in a row was Lindsey Vonn between 2009 and 2012 (4 in a row).
- Weirather was the only woman to win multiple super-G races on the World Cup last season. She won in Lake Louise and in Crans-Montana.
- Weirather has won seven World Cup races in total in super-G, one shy of equalling Hilde Gerg (8) in seventh place all-time among women.
- Weirather can become the fourth woman to win successive World Cup super-G races in Lake Louise, after Lara Gut-Behrami (2013-2014), Vonn (2010-2011-2012) and Katja Seizinger (1992-1994).
- Weirather has claimed three World Cup podiums in super-G in Lake Louise. Only Vonn (8), Gut-Behrami (4) and Renate Götschl (4) have more.
- Weirather and Gut-Behrami are the only women to have won a World Cup super-G event in each of the previous three seasons.

### Gut-Behrami looking for fourth super-G win in Lake Louise

- Lara Gut-Behrami finished second in the super-G standings last season. She previously won the crystal globe in this event in 2014 and 2016.
- Gut-Behrami has won 12 World Cup races in the super-G, joint-fourth most among women alongside Carole Merle. Only Lindsey Vonn (28), Renate Götschl (17) and Katja Seizinger (16) have won more.
- Gut-Behrami (2013, 2014, 2016) has won three World Cup super-G races in Lake Louise, one shy of the women's record held by Vonn.
- Lake Louise (3), Garmisch-Partenkirchen (2) and Cortina d'Ampezzo (2) are the ski resorts where Gut-Behrami has won multiple World Cup super-G races.
- Gut-Behrami and Tina Weirather are the only women to have won a World Cup super-G event in each of the previous three seasons.

### Other contenders

- The last seven super-G races on the World Cup have been won by seven different women: Jasmine Flury, Lindsey Vonn, Anna Veith, Federica Brignone, Lara Gut-Behrami, Tina Weirather, and Sofia Goggia.
- The last time eight successive World Cup super-G races were won by eight different women was from 1998 to 1999 (run of 10).
- **Anna Veith** won the Olympic silver medal in the ladies' super-G in PyeongChang. She has won three super-G events on the World Cup: Garmisch-Partenkirchen in 2013, Bansko in 2015, and Val d'Isère in 2017.
- Veith has claimed 22 World Cup podiums in super-G, sixth-most among women. Hilde Gerg is in fifth place on 23 podiums in this event.

- Veith has finished on three World Cup super-G podiums in Lake Louise, but she has yet to take first place. Only Gerg (5) has claimed more podiums in this event in Lake Louise without winning.
- Veith has only claimed more World Cup super-G top-three finishes in Cortina d'Ampezzo (4) than in Lake Louise (3).
- **Federica Brignone** has recorded three World Cup podium finishes in super-G, of which two were first places. Only Karen Putzer (4) and Isolde Kostner (3) have won more World Cup races in this event among Italian women.
- **Ester Ledecká** won the Olympic title in ladies' super-G in PyeongChang. Her best result in a World Cup super-G race is a 19th place, recorded in Lake Louise in 2016 and in Garmisch-Partenkirchen in 2017.
- Ledecká could become the first Czech woman (incl. Czechoslovakia) to finish on the podium of a super-G race on the World Cup.
- **Viktoria Rebensburg** finished second in the last World Cup super-G race, in Åre. It was her first super-G podium on the World Cup in over two years.
- Rebensburg has claimed two World Cup victories in super-G, in Schladming in 2012 and in Cortina d'Ampezzo in 2013. Four German women have won more: Katja Seizinger (16), Hilde Gerg (8), Marina Kiehl (6) and Maria Höfl-Riesch (3).
