

PREVIEW LADIES' PARALLEL SLALOM – Sunday 9 Dec 2018

Shiffrin eyeing additional win in parallel slalom

- Mikaela Shiffrin won the only previous individual parallel slalom held on the World Cup, in Courchevel on 20 December 2017.
- The only ladies' disciplines previously staged which had the same winner in the first two events were giant slalom (Nancy Greene) and alpine combined (Annemarie Moser-Pröll, first three).
- Heading into the weekend, Shiffrin has 46 World Cup wins, equal to Renate Götschl in fourth place all-time among women. Lindsey Vonn (82), Moser-Pröll (62) and Vreni Schneider (55) have won more World Cup races.
- Heading into the weekend, Shiffrin has won only one World Cup race in St. Moritz as she won the slalom on 19 March 2016. She finished 20th in the super-G in St. Moritz last year.
- Petra Vlhová came second in the parallel slalom in Courchevel last year.
- Vlhová has won four World Cup races in her career, all slalom races. This is one short of the Slovakian female record, held by Veronika Velez-Zuzulová, who won four slalom races and one city event.
- Irene Curtoni came third in the parallel slalom in Courchevel. Her only other podium on the World Cup was third place in the giant slalom in Ofterschwang in 2012.
- Michelle Gisin (5th in the slalom in Killington) is looking for her third World Cup podium finish on home snow after a second place in St. Moritz last season in super-G and a second place in Crans-Montana in alpine combined on 4 March 2018. (NOTE: excluding possible podium finish in super-G on Saturday).
