## City event returns to Oslo for another year

- Marcel Hirscher is the only man to have won multiple City Events in the World Cup. He won in Moscow on 29 January 2013 and in Stockholm on 23 February 2016.
- Alexis Pinturault (Moscow 2012), Felix Neureuther (Munich 2013), Linus Strasser (Stockholm 2017), André Myhrer (Oslo 2017) and Ramon Zenhäusern (Stockholm 2017) are the other active male skiers to have won a City Event in the World Cup.
- Myhrer won last year's City Event in Oslo, beating Michael Matt in the big final. It was his eighth and last World Cup victory to date.
- Myhrer has collected a record of five World Cup podiums in City Events. Hirscher, Pinturault and Strasser follow on three podiums each.
- Only Myhrer (6) and Pinturault (4) have reached the semifinals more than three times in a men's World Cup City Event.
- Zenhäusern has won the last City Event in the World Cup, in Stockholm on 30 January 2018. It was his first World Cup podium in any event.
- Swiss men have collected 10 podium finishes in this World Cup season, already second-most for them in the last seven seasons after their 13 podiums in 2017/18.
- Pinturault has won 21 World Cup races and needs one more to equal the French record held by Carole Merle (22).
- Dave Ryding has finished in the top-four in a World Cup City Event on two occasions, losing to Mattias Hargin in the small final in Stockholm on 31 January 2017 and to Linus Strasser in Oslo on 1 January 2018.
- A skier from Great Britain, male or female, has yet to win a World Cup race in any discipline.
- Henrik Kristoffersen failed to survive the first round in all four World Cup City Events he participated in.
- Kristoffersen has yet to win his first World Cup race on home snow.
- Michael Matt finished second in the City Event in Oslo last year. His only win in the World Cup came in the slalom in Kranjska Gora on 5 March 2017.
