

SARASOTA FESTIVAL OF NEW PLAYS

At Florida Studio Theatre, springtime means more than just flowers and warmer weather. Spring means it's time for the Sarasota Festival of New Plays, when never-before-seen plays, Cabarets, and musicals grace the stages of FST to be seen for the first time by live audiences.

As Sarasota's Contemporary Theatre, FST is dedicated to developing the new plays of today and encouraging the imaginations of the playwrights of tomorrow.

VISIT JOE WHITEFEATHER

At the heart of the Sarasota Festival of New Plays is Visit Joe Whitefeather (and bring the family!), a World Premiere production by award-winning playwright Bruce Graham. FST commissioned Graham to write the quirky comedy as part of its Playwrights Project, an artistic initiative that was launched in the early months of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Project employed over 30 of the country's top writers, including Graham, to create new works for FST's five stages.



Since the summer of 2020, FST has been working closely with Graham to develop Visit Joe Whitefeather, hosting readings over Zoom and inviting small audiences to see the play as it evolved. The comedy was even part of last year's annual Burdick New Play Festival. "With a comedy it all comes down to one thing: did the audience laugh?" said playwright Bruce Graham. "You can't do comedy in a vacuum, so the Festival workshop was a HUGE help in the development of the play." From that experience, Graham was able to determine what scenes needed shaping, what lines needed editing, and what storylines were unclear. Now you can see the outcome of Graham's—and FST's—hard work for yourself!

REEL MUSIC

Playing on the opposite side of the Hegner Theatre Wing is Reel Music, a FST original Cabaret celebrating the music of the movies. Created by FST's team of Cabaret Developers, Reel Music takes audiences on a



journey through the cinematic music that created the soundtrack to the last century. With classics like "Singing in the Rain," "Circle of Life," and "My Heart Will Go On," Reel Music reminds audiences that movies and music have always gone hand in hand.

"Reel Music connects with the audience in a very organic, authentic way," said cast member Liz Power. "These are songs that can transport people back to a certain time or memory."

Called "A fun and entertaining musical show" by Venice Gondolier Sun, Reel Music plays in FST's Court Cabaret through June 25.

SARASOTA FESTIVAL OF NEW PLAYS

THE LAST ACORN

Every spring, FST's award-winning WRITE A PLAY program wraps up with a professional production of plays inspired by the imaginations of children in sixth grade and below. WRITE A PLAY is an arts-in-education



initiative that provides students with the example, the inspiration, and the skills to write their own original plays.

This school year, students saw FST's production of the beloved classic Charlotte's Web, learned the fundamentals of playwriting during an in-class workshop, and then put pen to paper, letting their imaginations run wild. After all of this, students submitted their work to FST's annual youth playwriting competition, which, this year, received plays by over 4,000 playwrights. Each year, about a dozen winning plays are selected to be brought to life in a full-scale production performed by

professional actors. This season's collection of winning plays is called The Last Acorn& Other Winning Plays, which, this spring, is running in FST's Keating Theatre for families on select Saturdays and Sundays.

THE BURDICK NEW PLAY FESTIVAL

One part of FST's robust New Play Development program is its annual Richard & Betty Burdick New Play Festival, which is celebrating its 39th year this spring. This Burdick Festival gives select works-in-progress a platform, live audience, artistic support, and valuable feedback so they can continue to evolve.

This year's Festival features three staged readings of new works by contemporary American playwrights, including the quirky comedy, Advice by Brent Askari; the heartfelt one-man musical, Todd vs. The Titanic by Scott Rothman, Joe Kinosian, and Kellen Blair; and the dark comedy, Bleeding Hearts by Steve Yockey.

Each playwright will travel to Sarasota for a week of rehearsals with FST's artistic staff and guest artists.



At the end of each week of development sessions, a workshop reading of their play or musical will be performed for a live audience, followed by a discussion with the audience about the work-in-progress.

The Festival will take place on April 21, April 28, and May 5 at 3PM each day in FST's Keating Theatre. If you're interested in seeing brand-new plays before they ever receive their world premieres, stop by FST's Box Office at intermission.

EXECUTIVE STAFF

RICHARD HOPKINS is the Producing Artistic Director and CEO of Florida Studio Theatre. Since his arrival at FST in 1980, Mr. Hopkins has guided the theatre from a small touring company to a nationally recognized regional theatre that impacts over 200,000 adults and children annually. He created the New Play Development Program, the Cabaret Series, and FST's awardwinning WRITE A PLAY Program. Mr. Hopkins is the recipient of numerous awards including the Arts Leadership Award from the Sarasota Arts Council, the Richard G. Fallon Award for Artistic Excellence from the Florida Professional Theatres Association, the 2012 Cultural Champion Award from the Arts and Cultural Alliance of Sarasota County, and the 2016 Luminaire Award honoring excellence in creativity, philanthropy, advocacy, and all elements that are key to future growth of the arts in Sarasota.

REBECCA HOPKINS serves as Managing Director for Florida Studio Theatre, and as such, is the Chief Operations Officer. Mrs. Hopkins is responsible for oversight of FST's Administration, includina the Business Office, Development, Marketing, Box Office, Front of House, Restaurant, Budgeting, and maintaining the overall quality of FST's internal management. Mrs. Hopkins serves on the Board of Directors for the League of Resident Theatres and for the Theatre Communications Group. She is the former President of the National New Play Network. Mrs. Hopkins has been actively involved in development of FST's Cabaret productions since her arrival in 1998. In addition to being Lead Developer for The '70s: More Than A Decade, this season she also served on the development team for Reel Music. In addition, she is the Founder and Producer of FST Improv and the Sarasota Improv Festival. In 2012, the Arts & Cultural Alliance awarded Mrs. Hopkins the Cultural Champion Award in recognition of her many years of accomplishment and growth with Florida Studio Theatre. In 2016, Mrs. Hopkins was awarded the Luminaire Award, honoring excellence in creativity, philanthropy, advocacy, and all elements that are keys to future growth of the arts in Sarasota.
