Most recently, Etan co-ran the second season of the critically acclaimed Sorry For Your Loss, starring Elizabeth Olsen. Previously, Etan wrote on and produced the first seven seasons of Shameless. Additional television credits include: Get Shorty, Animal Kingdom, and Friday Night Lights. He has twice been nominated for Writers Guild Awards. Etan's play Create Fate was produced at the Williamstown Theatre Festival, directed by Christopher Ashley. The Fearless, directed by Scott Schwartz, was produced in New York at the Summer Play Festival. Other plays, including Truth and Reconciliation, Paralyzed and The Treehouse, have been developed at the Huntington Theatre Company, New York Stage and Film, Williamstown Theatre Festival, Cape Cod Theatre Project, and Pittsburgh's City Theatre, among others. Mr. Hopkins led the development of FST's Cabaret productions of *The Wanderers*, Outlaws and Angels, Guitar Girls, Mack the Knife, Older Than Dirt, Piano Men, and more. Since his arrival at FST in 1980, Mr. Hopkins has guided the theatre from a small touring company to a nationally recognized regional theatre that impacts over 200,000 adults and children annually. He created the New Play Development Program, the Cabaret Series, and FST's awardwinning WRITE A PLAY Program. Mr. Hopkins is the recipient of numerous awards including the Arts Leadership Award from the Sarasota Arts Council, the Richard G. Fallon Award for Artistic Excellence from the Florida Professional Theatres Association, the 2012 Cultural Champion Award from the Arts and Cultural Alliance of Sarasota County, and the 2016 Luminaire Award honoring excellence in creativity, philanthropy, advocacy, and all elements that are key to future growth of the arts in Sarasota.

REBECCA HOPKINS serves as Managing Director for Florida Studio Theatre, and as such, is the Chief Operations Officer. Mrs. Hopkins is responsible for oversight of FST's Administration, including the Business Office, Development, Marketing, Box Office, Front of House, Restaurant, Budgeting, and maintaining the overall quality of FST's internal management. Mrs. Hopkins serves on the Board of Directors for the League of Resident Theatres and for the Theatre Communications Group. She is the former President of the National New Play Network.
