



Dorothy's Dictionary had its world premiere at Theatre Lab in Boca Raton, Florida in 2022, directed by Matt Stabile.



Ms. Alexander has directed numerous productions and premieres on the FST stages, including, but not limited to: Bad Books, The Heart Sellers; The Cancellation of Lauren Fein; The Outsider; Troubadour; Pictures From Home; Black Pearl Sings!; The Last Match; What the Constitution Means to Me; Maytaq Virgin; The Legend of Georgia McBride; America in One Room; Bright Star; Ethel Waters: His Eye is on the Sparrow; Wednesday's Child; Cherry Docs; Straight White Men; Always...Patsy Cline; The Things They Carried; Native Gardens; Heisenberg; The Absolute Brightness of Leonard Pelkey; and brownsville song (b-side for tray). Ms. Alexander has also been a resident actress for over 25 years. Some of her leading roles were in the plays: Edward Albee's The Goat; Filumena; Master Class; Edward Albee's Three Tall Women; The Occupant; The Play About the Baby; Golda's Balcony; and Taking Shakespeare. Ms. Alexander is the recipient of numerous acting, directing, and public service awards, including FAER, She Knows Where She's Going Award (Girls, Inc.), The Woman of Light Award, National Council of Jewish Women Award, The Woman of Power Award, the Sarasota County Arts Leadership Award, Education Award, Sarasota Manatee Jewish Federation, The Unity Award, and, most recently, the Suncoast Woman of Action Award. Ms. Alexander leads the FST Forums Series and developed the Blue Butterfly Theatre Program, a program for teens suffering from grief or loss. She created the Art of The Gesture program at Ringling College of Animation and is the co-author of The Animated Short with Karen Sullivan, moving into its 3rd edition.

#### AMOREENA TILLMAN

(Stage Management Intern) is a recent graduate of Florida State University with a B.A. In Theatre and emphasis in Stage Management. While at FSU, she worked as both a Stage Manager and run crew on plays and musicals including 9 to 5, Bulrusher, and R & H's Cinderella. Previous FST credits: Jersey Boys, Bad Books, Advice, Deck the Halls, and Waitress.

### E. M. LEWIS

(Playwright) E. M. Lewis is an awardwinning playwright, teacher, lyricist, and opera librettist. Her work has been produced around the world, and published by Samuel French. Lewis received the Steinberg Award for How the Light Gets In and Song of Extinction and the Primus Prize for *Heads* from the American Theater Critics Association, the Ted Schmitt Award from the Los Angeles Drama Critics Circle for outstanding writing of a world premiere play, a Hodder Fellowship from Princeton University, a playwriting fellowship from the New Jersey State Arts Commission, the 2016 Oregon Literary Fellowship in Drama, and an Edgerton Award for her epic Antarctic play Magellanica that was produced at Artists Repertory Theater in 2018 and released as a five-part audio podcast in 2020. She also received a Distinguished Alumni Citation for Professional Achievement in 2024 from her alma mater, Willamette University. Other plays by Lewis include: Apple Season (rolling world premiere from the National New Play Network), Infinite Black Suitcase, The Gun Show (more than fifty productions across the country, and featured at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival), True Story, Dorothy's Dictionary, You Can See All the Stars (a play for college students commissioned by the Kennedy Center). The Great Divide (commissioned by the Oregon Shakespeare Festival as part of their American Revolutions program, cocommissioned by Artists Repertory Theater), and How the Light Gets In (a semi-finalist for the O'Neill that premiered at Boston Court Pasadena in 2019, and was produced at 1st Stage in Virginia in 2023). Sherlock Holmes and the Case of the Fallen Giant, a new opera commissioned by American Lyric Theater that Lewis wrote with composer Evan Meier, had an orchestral workshop in New York City in February 2020, an academic premiere at Portland State University in 2023, and its professional premiere at Opera Modesto in 2024. Town Hall, an opera about health care in America, seen through a small-town lens, created with composer Theo Popov, was produced at University of Maryland and Willamette University. In the last few years, Lewis wrote a ten-minute musical called The Letter with composer Stacey Philipps, and a full-length musical called *In the Deep* with composer Clarence Roscoe McDonald which premiered at Willamette University in fall of 2023. Recent work by Lewis includes a joyful quest story for four male actors called Apple Hunters! and an intense

feminist thriller for five women (and a wolf) called *Strange Birds*, which had a workshop production in University of California Santa Barbara's Launch Pad program in 2025. *The Frankenstein Project* — her biggest, newest, monster of a play — had a weeklong developmental workshop at Emerson College in 2024, through the Mellon Foundation, and a workshop production

at Florida Atlantic University in spring of 2025. Lewis is Playwright-in-Residence at Artists Repertory Theater, through the Mellon Foundation's National Playwright Residency Program. She is also a proud member of LineStorm Playwrights, Opera America, and the Dramatists Guild. She lives on her family's farm in Oregon.

### **RICHARD HOPKINS**

(Producing Artistic Director and CEO of Florida Studio Theatre). Mr. Hopkins has fostered the development of FST's Mainstage and Cabaret productions. Mr. Hopkins serves as the Chief Executive Officer of Florida Studio Theatre. He Oversees the creation and implementation of all FST programming, including Mainstage, Cabaret, Stage III, New Play Development, Education, and Touring. Since his arrival at FST in 1980, Mr. Hopkins has guided the theatre from a small touring company to a nationally recognized regional theatre, which impacts over 220,000 adults and children annually. He created the New Play Development program, the Cabaret Series, FST's award-winning WRITE A PLAY program, and has directed the design and renovation of all FST's theatres. Mr. Hopkins has a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Virginia Commonwealth University. He has served as a Theatre Specialist for the U.S. Department of State to Cairo and Amman, and taught at the Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Clown College. He is the recipient of numerous awards including the Arts Leadership Award from the former Sarasota

Arts Council, the Richard G. Fallon Award for Artistic Excellence from the Florida Professional Theatres Association, and the 2012 Cultural Champion Award from the Arts and Cultural Alliance of Sarasota County. In 2016, Mr. Hopkins received the Luminaire Award, honoring excellence in creativity, philanthropy, advocacy, and all elements that are key to future growth of the arts in Sarasota. In 2017, Mr. Hopkins was awarded the Florida Theatre Conference Lifetime Achievement Award for contributing to the rich cultural fabric of the Sarasota community and the state of Florida, and his dedication to developing future artists, educators, and advocates.

### **REBECCA HOPKINS**

(Managing Director and Chief Operations Officer). Under Ms. Hopkins' leadership, FST has grown into one of the largest regional theatres, engaging an audience of 220,000 annually. Ms. Hopkins currently serves as Vice President of the League of Resident Theatres. She is the former President of the National New Play Network and a former board member of Theatre Communications Group. She is a member of the Executive

Committee for the Sarasota Cultural Alliance. Ms. Hopkins has been actively involved in the development of FST's Cabaret productions since her arrival in 1998. In addition, she is the Founder of FST Improv and the Sarasota Improv Festival. In 2012, the Arts & Cultural Alliance awarded Ms. Hopkins the Cultural Champion Award in recognition of her many

years of accomplishment and growth with Florida Studio Theatre. In 2016, Ms. Hopkins received the Luminaire Award, honoring excellence in creativity, philanthropy, advocacy, and all elements that are keys to future growth of the arts in Sarasota.
