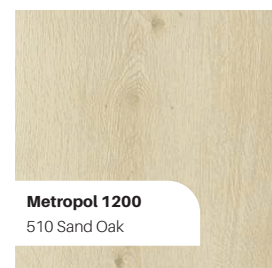
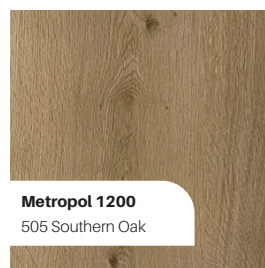
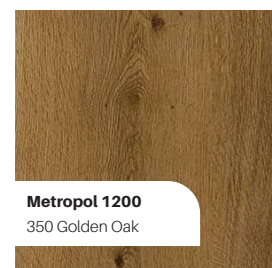
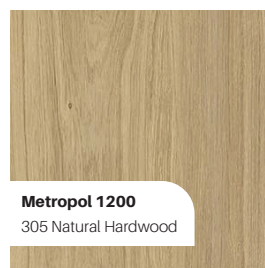
Flora-inspired Elements
