# A LOT to take in

Local foodies mix the old and new to create a novel dining experience at 1881 Kitchen Table

A mixture of old and new defines Port Chester's 1881 Kitchen Table, which (softly) opened July 12 with limited seating. The grand opening is set for Thursday. • The 90-seat space, where Eugene's Diner had been, is owned by Harrison residents (and first-time restaurateurs) Jennifer and Udi Livne, avid foodies who wanted to bring something new to the community. • First, that meant putting their stamp on the place with an artistic design featuring reclaimed wood and other upcycled items in addition to a stunning zinc bar and open kitchen. Jennifer credits her husband, whose hobby has long been sourcing random objects from around the world and turning them into treasures. Like the giant wheel that hangs over the bar. Or the wine room, crafted from what had been a closet that also houses an old plow. • Udi, she said, is attuned to every detail.
