

Comprehensive Master Plan

Completed January 2019

- Sets vision for parks, facilities, programming and services through 2028

Eight priorities

- Build more trails
- Add programming, events for diverse audiences
- Provide access to conservation areas
- Establish a define blueway system
- Focus on partnerships
- Build ecological resiliency and sustainability
- Expand access for all users





Feedback Received About Trails

- Prioritize trails
- Expand the regional trail system and its connections
- Trail expansions and connections should:
 - Focus on trails within parks
 - Fill in missing connections across the county
 - Increase trail/park access to underserved areas, adjacent neighborhoods





Benefits of Shared-Use Trails

- Free recreation and transportation opportunities
- Environmentally-friendly
- Improved health benefits
- Increased property values
- Increased job and local business revenues











Trail Development GOALS

- Enhance connectivity through safe and accessible alternative transportation options
- Improve pedestrian safety
- Provide non-vehicular access to greenspace and local businesses
- Improve air quality
- Improve community health and wellness
- Provide a high-quality outdoor recreation experience



Trail Development GOALS

- Provide learning moments for nature observation as well as conservation and sustainability education;
- Protect and enhance natural resources in the development and construction of the project;
- Identify opportunities to utilize low-impact construction techniques and options;
- Incorporate strategic use of green infrastructure practices to build ecological resiliency.



Trail Development HISTORY & CONTEXT

- Vision of a shared-use trail in the Mill Creek watershed dates back 20+ years
- Great Parks has wanted to create a connection to Winton Woods since Glenwood Gardens was acquired in the 1990's

- Examined multiple route options











Route Selection FEASIBILITY STUDY PREFERRED ALIGNMENT

- Reviewed a broad variety of options
- Recommended route that best satisfies goals









Expanding Connections

The Proposed Route:

- Builds on the preliminary alternative alignment
- Connects two Great Parks
- Connects multiple communities
- Is located entirely on public land/easements

- West Fork Mill Creek Trail
- Harbor Loop Trail (Winton Woods)
- Multiple trails in between

Expansion

- 3.6 miles of new trail
- Nine miles of continuous trail

- Paved, 12 feet wide
- ADA-accessible
- Supports most forms of non-motorized travel
- Provides new access points to parks
 - Additional access improvements
