Your Great Parks: Our Roots in Archery

Adventure Outpost has been running archery programming since 2007, but did you know that the sport of archery has a long history in Great Parks?



In the early 1940s, both an archery range and archery golf course were operated at Sharon Woods by the Cincinnati Archery Association. Beginning in the late 1940s, the Winton Bowmen began operating an archery range at Winton Woods. That archery range grew to cover more than 70 acres, and included both men's and women's ranges, two field courses, and a 9-hole archery golf course.

The Winton Bowmen were led by a man named George Helwig, who went on to coach the U.S. Olympic team in 1972 and 1976, serve as a referee in the 1984 Olympic Games, and direct national tournaments at Miami University for 31 years. George also founded the Junior Olympic Archery Development Program. He is a 1980 inductee of the Archery Hall of Fame. Speaking of the Archery Hall of Fame, another inductee, Ann Clark (Class of 1984), got her start in the sport with the Winton Bowmen at Winton Woods in 1955. She was such a natural, she won the National Archery Association Championship that same year. Ann went on to win multiple championships and receive numerous awards over her 57-year career in archery.

Sadly, the 1960s led to a decline in archery in the parks. Fast forward a few decades, where the Adventure Outpost crew resurrected archery at Winton Woods through a grant from the National Archery in Schools Program. Beginning in 2007, thousands of park guests have been able to learn the basics of shooting a bow on an outdoor range at Adventure Outpost. In 2018, we transitioned to certification with U.S.A. Archery (formerly the National Archery Association), which is the national governing body for competition and the Olympic Team. We are proud to say we are the only outdoor range that provides instruction in Greater Cincinnati. Currently we offer Basic Archery and Archery Games, and we will be offering Intermediate Archery beginning in May.

If you haven't tried it, come join us for a program and give it a shot! The Hall of Fame is waiting.
