The Music Garden is Taking Shape

The clattering sounds of backhoes and hammers in Glenwood Gardens' Highfield Meadow will soon be replaced with that of chimes, drums and children's laughter.

The Music Garden that will occupy this space is under construction and on track for a soft opening in December of this year. The stage, with its recorder-shaped columns and arch containing music from the well-known "You Are My Sunshine" (pictured above), has been erected. The outdoor instruments have begun to be placed and the concrete treble clef that forms the walks through the garden (pictured below) and that will allow quests to access the stage and instruments has been installed. Prior to





December's soft opening, all instruments, an accessible walk to the stage and benches throughout the garden will also be in place.

The Music Garden's climax will be in Spring of 2023 when the colorful and textured plants emphasizing the garden's purpose of connecting music and nature have been installed. At this time, it will become another exciting addition to the Highfield Discovery Garden that staff can take proud ownership of and guests can use their imaginations to explore.

**We ask that ONLY lights be placed in bins. No bags, boxes or containers of any kind!

This is the ninth year for the program that keeps lights out of landfills and gives them new life by refining the precious metals and materials to produce new products. Over the past eight years, over 26,600 pounds of lights have been recycled. The program also gives back to ongoing Great Parks conservation efforts thanks to a generous donation from Cohen each year.
