

Winton Woods Campground

Rules

FOR SITES 1-68 and 1F-25F, YOUR CAMPSITE IS TO THE LEFT OF YOUR SITE POST AND DRIVEWAY.



REFUNDS/CANCELLATIONS

Camping is an outdoor experience-discounts/refunds will not be given due to inclement weather. Reservations are refundable if more than 30 days before check-in. If cancelling between 30 days and 48 hours before check-in, a \$5 cancellation fee will be charged. The remaining balance will be put on a Great Parks gift certificate and sent to the email on file. This gift certificate can be used at all Great Parks' locations. If cancelling inside 48 hours before check-in, there is no refund given and no gift certificate issued.

CHECK-IN

Earliest check-in is 2 p.m. Campers must stop at the Campground Office to obtain paperwork before entering the campground. When the Campground Office is closed, call 513-851-2267 to obtain after-hour check-in information. CALL THIS NUMBER BEFORE CLOSE. Hours of operation can be found at greatparks.org.

CHECK-OUT

Latest check-out is 12 noon. Campers must vacate their site by the date shown on their site tag. Campers must notify the Campground Office of any difficulty vacating their site. Failure to comply may result in impoundment of all property left on the site and an additional charge.

CAMPING EQUIPMENT

Campers may have one camping unit, one tent and one dining fly; or two tents and one dining fly. A camping unit is defined as an RV, fifth-wheel, trailer or pop-up. Camping in vehicles is not allowed--a camping unit or tent must be present on the campsite. RVs, fifth-wheels and trailers must remain on the gravel pad. Tents and single-axle pop-ups are permitted on the grass. If you have a larger camping unit, this may reduce the vehicles that will fit on the gravel pad. Your second vehicle will have to park in the campground parking lot with the Campground Vehicle Tag on the rear-view mirror.

OCCUPANCY

Occupancy is no more than 14 nights in 30 days. No more than six (6) people may occupy a site. There must be someone 18 years of age staying on the site and assumes responsibility for all campers on that site; at least 21 years of age or older for cabins.

CAMPER CONDUCT & BYLAWS

All Great Parks' bylaws and regulations apply to the campground. Great Parks' Rangers may terminate occupancy, or remove individuals from the campground, with no refund or credit at their sole discretion. Profanity and loud/abusive behavior, and loud music is prohibited. Conduct that could endanger the welfare of others or infringe on others' enjoyment will not be tolerated.

VISITORS

Visiting hours are from 9 a.m.-11 p.m. Campers are responsible for their visitors' actions. Visitors must comply with campground rules. Profanity and loud or abusive behavior, and loud music is prohibited. Conduct that could endanger the welfare of others or infringe on others' enjoyment will not be tolerated. Rangers may remove individuals from the campground at their sole discretion.

MOTOR VEHICLES

Two vehicles are permitted to park at the campsite. DO NOT PARK ON THE GRASS! Vehicles parked at the campsite must display a valid Campground Vehicle Pass on the rear-view mirror for all days camping. This serves as your Motor Vehicle Permit requirement while you are camping in the Park. Additional vehicles must park in the campground parking lot and must display a valid Motor Vehicle Permit sticker. Motor Vehicle Permits can be purchased at the Welcome Tech booths, Campground Office, and Boathouse.

QUIET HOURS

Quiet hours are from 11 p.m.-9 a.m. If you/your site can be heard on another site, then you are too loud. Generators, flood lights, radios, TVs, etc. may not be used during quiet hours.

CAMPFIRES

Fires are permitted in fire rings only or campers' grills for cooking. Fires should not exceed three feet high. Do not move fire rings on your site. Do not cut trees/limbs for fire wood. Do not use chain saws. Do not leave fire unattended. Extinguish your fire before checking out. An emergency fire extinguisher is located on the outside of the shower house.

FIREWOOD QUARANTINE

To help prevent the spread of invasive insects, our region is under a firewood quarantine. These pests spread primarily through movement of firewood. Therefore, movement of firewood in or out of the campground is prohibited. Approved firewood is available for purchase at the Campground Office.

SHOWERHOUSE

The shower house is available for campers' use only. Shower house is not available for non-campers. Parking at the shower house is available when using the shower house and is limited to 30 minutes. Visitors may not park at the shower house.

CONSERVATION

Cutting or chopping of trees/limbs and vegetation and collecting natural material for firewood is prohibited. Mistreating wildlife is prohibited. Feeding wildlife is prohibited. Feeding wildlife can cause dependency on people for food which can lead to a loss of survival instincts, create conflicts and possibly spread disease.

CAMPGROUND SHELTER

Registered campers may use the campground shelter by the playground from 9 a.m.-11 p.m. while currently camping. This is not open to the public. No alcohol at the shelter. Quiet hours must be followed.

CLEAN SITE / TRASH / RECYCLING

Campers must maintain a clean campsite. Campers are to place all trash and recyclables in the appropriate dumpster at check-out. **DO NOT BURN TRASH IN YOUR CAMPSITE FIRE RING!** Vacated sites requiring cleanup by staff may be assessed an additional fee.

The clear plastic bag is for recycling purposes. Please recycle paper; plastic bottles, jugs and jars; glass bottles and jars; aluminum, steel and tin cans. **DO NOT RECYCLE:** Plastic shopping bags, disposable cups (no Styrofoam), paper plates, and food containers. Dispose of your recycling bag in the green dumpster in the campground.

LOW SPEED VEHICLES (Ex: Golf Carts)

Low speed vehicle (LSV) use is allowed. A maximum of one LSV is permitted per campsite. Driver must be 16 years of age or older and have a valid driver's license. LSV is limited inside the campground road. No LSV is permitted to travel on any other park road. LSV is for daytime use only unless equipped with headlights and taillights. LSV must obey all road signs and traffic laws, and must travel in the same direction as vehicle traffic. Failure to follow these rules may result in Ranger impoundment and a ticket.

SEWAGE DUMP STATION

Campers must stay with their camper at all times until servicing is complete, and must remove their camper from the dump station area immediately afterwards. Use the hose to flush down the concrete apron after use. An additional fee is required for use by non-campers.

PETS

Pets are permitted at your campsite. Pets must be kept on a leash, a maximum of 6 feet, at all times and under control at all times. Barking or aggressive dogs will not be tolerated. Great Parks' Rangers may terminate occupancy, or remove individuals from the campground, with no refund or credit, at their sole discretion. Pet owners must clean their campsite after their pets upon check-out. **PETS ARE NOT ALLOWED WHEN STAYING IN A CABIN.**

ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION

Alcohol may be consumed on campsites subject to Ohio laws. Consumption is not permitted in public areas (parking lots, campground road, campground playground, etc.).

FISHING

Bank fishing is permitted by registered campers that are staying on lakeside campsites. Campers are only authorized to bank fish from their own registered campsite. **DO NOT BANK FISH ON SOMEONE ELSE'S CAMPSITE!** Fishing is also permitted at the canoe/kayak launch. A valid Ohio fishing license is required.

BOATING / NO SWIMMING

Campers are permitted to launch their private canoes or kayaks at the ramp located between sites 47 and 49. Canoes and kayaks must be licensed. All Ohio watercraft laws apply. Kayak spray skirts are not allowed. **SWIMMING IN WINTON LAKE IS NOT ALLOWED.**

SEVERE WEATHER

Great Parks highly recommends that outdoor activities cease, and everyone seek shelter when severe weather is present. Great Parks is not responsible for inclement weather. Remember: When thunder roars, go indoors.

SAFETY

Participation in group gatherings may result in injury or contracting illnesses including communicable diseases such as influenza, MRSA, Coronavirus, etc. There can be hazards with camping. There are risks that cannot be eliminated. Camping at any Great Parks campground is at your own risk. Fireworks, firearms or weapons of any kind are not permitted.

FOOD & SUNDRIES AVAILABLE IN THE CAMP STORE

Ice, firewood, coffee, ice cream, various sundries and camping items are all available in the campground office.

EMERGENCIES

For emergency assistance call 911. For non-emergency assistance, contact the Great Parks' Rangers at 513-521-3980. For after hours, contact 513-825-2280. An emergency telephone is located outside the Campground Office. Great Parks' Rangers patrol 24 hours a day.

As a matter of courtesy, our guests are expected to exercise good common sense and respect for others. Please remember that we enforce our rules to protect our guests, our staff, and our Parks.
