2022 A Year in Review!

It's said every year, but somehow 2022 has come to an end and 2023 is here! In many ways 2022 felt like the beginning of a return to normal. As the world opened again, a lot of our beloved programs and special events made a grand return! We were able to gather in person again and see so many of you at our various volunteer meetings and annual celebration event.

Despite all of the challenges we have faced the last few years, the amazing support that volunteers have for Great Parks has been constant. Here are just a few things volunteers and staff accomplished this year, while working together:

- Removed at least 948 bags of trash, 85 bags of recycling, and 33 tires from park lands and around waterways, which positively affects the water quality not only in our parks, but also all the streams and rivers which make their way to the Mississippi River and down to the Gulf of Mexico! Never forget, it's all connected!
- Planted 2926 trees and shrubs, leading to better habitat for local wildlife, increased shaded areas for park guests, and less mowing for staff which means saving funds, using less gas, and less warming for the entire PLANET!!
- Walked, monitored, and improved over 72 miles of trail by removing 76 water bars and installing other sustainable measures. This means less erosion on the trails, less maintenance for our staff and safer trails for quests.
- Removed 19.5 acres of invasive plants, making room for native plants to grow which results in better food sources and overall habitat for native wildlife.
- Harvested buckets and buckets of native seeds at the Shaker Trace Nursery, so that we can continue to create new habitats and sustain the old with local plant genotypes.
- Spread 65 cubic yards of mulch, which helps plants retain moisture, contributes to our water conservation efforts, and provides appealing outdoor spaces for park guests to enjoy.
- Helped bring Kid's Expo back and engaged over 3,000 people from the local community, schools, and camps in outdoor education & recreation.
- Saw the beginning of our Holidays on the Farm event, 29 of you braved the cold weather to bring smiles to thousands of our guests this holiday season.
- Welcomed 88 new long-term volunteers to the team!
- Contributed over 26,800 hours of service to Great Parks!

These numbers show us just a glimpse of some of the amazing things that were accomplished by volunteers this year. We know there are so many more moments that simply can't be quantified. So, from the bottom of our hearts, thank you for all that you have done to support Great Parks throughout 2022. We are so excited to see what 2023 will bring!
