What is your life motto? Be Kind. Be Inquisitive. Be Joyful.

What cause are you passionate about? International Rhino Foundation (IRF). I recently went to Indonesia for 2 weeks with IRF. They are a spectacular charity focused on the conservation of the 5 species of rhinos. The 2 species native to Indonesia are the Sumatran and Javan. The Sumatran Rhino Sanctuary just had a baby Sumatran Rhino born. The last time a baby Sumatran Rhino was born was 17 years ago! I learned firsthand how the monies are spent toward the Javan and Sumatran Rhino and how they work with the local communities and government to educate the importance of the native rhinos. It is an all-hands-on-deck model, and it is amazing what they have been able to accomplish.

What is your favorite Great Park? Winton Woods, solely based on the proximity to my house. One of the perks of volunteering with the Great Parks is getting to see and enjoy the other parks.

HerpBlitz in the Wild Wild West!

On Saturday, May 20, Great Parks staff, volunteers, Ohio Partners in Amphibian and Reptile Conservation (OHPARC) members, and college students participated in a BioBlitz at the Reid Tract, a natural, undeveloped area of land close to Mitchell Memorial Forest. Typically, BioBlitz



community science programs gather data about all species in a designated area. For our HerpBlitz, we focused specifically on amphibian and reptile species to monitor the success of herps in this area. The 17 staff, community partners, and volunteers used various methods to survey the area, including coverboards, turtle traps, dip nets, and visual encounters. The eight species recorded were the American toad, green frog, spring peeper, bullfrog, Northern two-lined salamander, ravine salamander, red-backed salamander, and plenty of Eastern garter snakes.

Performing surveys like this can give us a better understanding of what species reside in our wild spaces in our parks. This crucial data guides our management decisions to ensure reclamation efforts after a natural or human-caused disaster incorporate restoring habitat for our local herps.

I also want to thank everyone that made this event possible. A big thank you goes to Megan Seymour with OPARC and USFWS for providing coverboards. Another big thank you to Richard Phillips with Wittenberg University and OHPARC for providing turtle traps. A huge shoutout to our volunteer engagement staff for catering lunch for those who helped the day of the event. Thank you to those who were on the planning committee for this project - especially Gregor Bundy for allowing us to enjoy a part of Mitchell Memorial Forest that not too many people get to see. Lastly, a big thank you to both the Great Parks staff and volunteers who helped the day of the event! I hope you were able to learn something about our scaly and slimy friends that call our parks home!
