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Pre-Kindergarten

Spring on the Farm

Available April & May

Spring is in the air at Parky's Farm! Explore the garden to see what's sprouting and learn how the animals are getting ready for warmer weather. Take a wagon ride through the woods to see the spring changes up close. During this program students will:

- Meet farm animals and learn their basic needs
- Discover the basic needs of plants and help in the garden
- Learn about the spring changes that happen on the farm
- Take a wagon ride

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Kindergarten - Third Grade

Fall on the Farm

Available Sept. & Oct.

Fall is a busy time on the farm! Help the farmers get ready for winter on the barnyard and learn about how the animals are getting ready too. Journey through the woods on a wagon ride to see the changing seasons up close. During this program students will:

- Discover how the farm animals prepare for winter
- Help our local wildlife brave the cold by building toad homes
- Observe the changing seasons on a wagon ride

Farms, Gardens & Me

Available April & May

Take a journey to the barnyard and garden to discover what plants, animals and people need to survive. Help in the garden and on the farm and learn about where our food comes from. Relax and journey through the woods on a wagon ride. During this program students will:

- Meet some animals and learn how their basic needs are met
- Dig in the garden to discover how plants grow and how they help us
- Relax on a wagon and learn about farm-wildlife interactions

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Fourth & Fifth Grade

Farms & Food Webs

Available Sept. & Oct., April & May

Discover the wonders of food webs fresh from the farm. Explore the barnyard, get your hands dirty in the garden, and learn how everything connects.

During this program students will:

- Learn about energy transfer
- Investigate their role and the roles of farms in the food web
- Explore the farmyard and garden
