Gestural Expressions and Sustainability Inspire HBF Textiles' Latest Launch

New Collection Highlights Two New Clean Impact Textiles[™] Woven Fabrics and HBF Textiles' First All-Silicone Coated Fabric Product

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HBF Textiles is pleased to introduce its new Spring 2022 Collection, Two-Part Harmony. A coalescence of two differentiated-yet-related fabric types inspired by gestural expressions and the delicate balance between shapes, textures, and colors, this latest series includes four woven fabrics and three coated performance fabric products. Both "parts" come together as an invigorating harmony bound by a refined array of colors and versatile application potential for corporate, hospitality, higher education, retail, and healthcare projects.

Through the new Two-Part Harmony collection, HBF Textiles is also furthering its mission to inspire conscious design choices that positively impact the environment with the debut of Crumpled Paper and Skim Coat—two new Clean Impact Textiles[™] bringing the total to three in its portfolio (Digital Bloom 2.0 was the first in 2021).

"Celebrating Earth Month—and indeed the entire year—is a central part of our commitment to sustainability at HBF Textiles," said Mary Jo Miller, VP Design and Creative Direction for HBF Textiles. "Our textiles are not just part of our designs; they are key to how we create those designs. In that spirit, we are continuing to add Clean Impact Textiles[™] to our portfolio, which is new fabric made from 100% post-consumer recycled polyester that is 91% biodegradable in a landfill."

"Our devotion to sustainability and circularity is ongoing and offers better long-term choices for the planet that have a positive impact on human health, the environment, and communities," Miller



added. "We believe it is important to continuously improve HBF Textiles' methods and materials in order for designers to meet their goals of creating beautiful contract spaces that are safe and healthy for everyone."

Part One: Woven Fabrics

Part One, available now, consists of woven fabrics that speak to dusty hues, light, shadow, as well as layering and movement. HBF Textiles balanced its textured solids in color shades and unique artwork with the introduction of an elegant Skim Coat; a graphic Crumpled Paper; a soft Dusted Fleck; and its pastel partner, Rush.

Sustainability and circularity continue to be core HBF drivers with the addition of two new Clean Impact Textiles[™] in post-consumer recycled biodegradable polyester: Crumpled Paper and Skim Coat. These patterns reduce environmental footprint with materials decomposing in landfills at a rate of 91% after 1,278 days (approximately 3 1/2 years) vs. regular polyester, which decomposes only 6% after the same period of time. In addition, these yarns are 100% post-consumer recycled polyester.

Part Two: Coated Fabrics

HBF Textiles has emerged from the recent pandemic with a focus on introducing high-hydrolysisrated products to the textile market. With a high hydrolysis and abrasion rating, this new collection of coated fabrics offers a newfound level of performance and versatility for contract furnishings.

Part Two, which will be released in May 2022, includes two new polycarbonate faux leathers, Well Loved and Notable Grain, along with the brand's first silicone product, Inherent—which is inherently flame resistant, inherently antimicrobial, and inherently stain resistant (with no additional treatments).

Two-Part Harmony is the culmination of years of experience, expertise, and research in the interaction between woven and coated textiles. This balanced collection creates an industry-changing approach to interior design by delivering a simple, unified yet impactful solution for specifiers in the industry. Prices range from \$27–\$69 per yard for woven fabrics and \$59–\$65 per yard for coated fabrics.
