

Routine Cleaning

Regularly vacuuming the pillows and cushions will keep your furniture free of crumbs, dirt, allergens, pet hair and dust. It will also stop dirt and dust from accumulating in the fibers, and help to maintain an overall clean appearance. Regularly clean your upholstery with the appropriate nozzle of your vacuum cleaner at the lowest setting. A quick once-over with a lint brush will restore the sensuous nap and soft luster of the upholstery.

Address spills immediately. Dab spots with a clean, light colored dry cloth to remove liquids and water.

- For mud, allow it to dry before removing. Then brush off the dirt and dust using a bristled brush or toothbrush.
- For food spills, use a spoon or spatula to scoop up spill.

Stain Removal

Stubborn stains:

- Test in an inconspicuous area first and dab thoroughly.
- Use a lightly colored damp cloth or sponge.
- Create a small amount of highly diluted mixture of warm water and dish soap solution. Do not directly apply dish soap because its harsh, grease-cutting formula can stain, leave residue, and damage the delicate material.
- Dry and buff the fabric. A portable hairdryer can be used to dry the fabric at a low setting.
- After drying, the fabric may have hard patches where stains were located. To soften the fabric, gently brush the area back-and-forth with a cleaned bristled brush or a clean toothbrush.
