CHALLENGE:

Designing for an elderly patient population required furniture solutions that emphasized safety, accessibility, and ease of use. The facility included smaller and irregularly shaped spaces, creating challenges for standard furniture layouts across both private and shared offices. In a high-use healthcare environment, materials also needed to support frequent cleaning while maintaining comfort and durability.

SOLUTION:

HON approached the project with a focus on accessibility, adaptability, and daily usability. Seating and furnishings were selected to support safe movement, provide consistent comfort, and function intuitively for patients and staff alike. Flexible solutions allowed spaces to adapt to irregular floorplans while healthcare-appropriate materials simplified cleaning and supported a hygienic, long-term care environment.
